PROSPECTS FOR THE 1974 TRACK AND FIELD TEAM:

Central traditionally has had a good track program. In the last three years, the Wildcats only lost one dual meet. Two years ago the team finished second in the conference, and last year Lionvale's men took the third-place spot.

In NAIA nationals last season, Central claimed the twelfth-place position.

"This year we are a very young team. We have 35 new athletes, mostly freshmen and sophomores. There is lots of breadth on the team, and depth is developing," says coach Tom Lionvale when surveying his team prospects for the new season.

"About 75% of the men are rounding the corner on their performance, and the others aren't far behind," he continues. "But we still aren't where I want us to be."

The coach predicts that in 1974 Central will be strong especially in the 440 runs and in the hurdles.

Reese Colbo, Dave Merrill, and Jim Noren will represent the squad in the quarter mile running events.

Representing the Wildcats in the hurdle will be; Tom Clark, a junior

who was fifth in the conference last season; Bill Freeburg, a junior transfer student from Big Bend Community College, who last year was a one-man team; and Nate Worsick, a sophomore from Gig Harbor, who placed third in the conference as a freshman.

Leading the sprinters will be Bellevue senior Clint Patton. Patton finished third and fourth in the conference last year.

The coach predicts that Pat Fitterer, John Krueger, and Henry Schellenberger also be excellent short distance runners.

On the half-mile is Mike Anderburg, a Seattle freshman, who ran in a time of 1:56 last year.

Jim Perry, former state champ in the quarter-mile, will begin training with the team at the beginning of spring quarter. Perry, a freshman from Cashmere, will be transferring from Spokane Community College.

Mile runner Lou Boudreaux, a freshman from South Kitsap, clocked a time of 4:18 last year.

Other good mile runners whom the coach expects to do well are sophomore Clayton Belmont and freshman Rich Johnson.

On the three-mile run, Lionvale expects Mike Christenson, Oak Harbor frosh, to be "very good." Lionvale's expectations also are high for sophcapre Ken Turner, who recently set a new school record in the marathon. His time was 2:40.48.

The coach expects Central to be a "bit thin" in the long jump, with only Craig Jones, a senior, competing. Jones's best distance is 23 feet.

Amply representing the Wildcats in the triple jump will be several 1973 Evergreen Conference place-winners. Athletes in that event will include: Rich Von Wells, sixth in the conference in 1973; Kurt Wagner, with a best distance of 44°; Jeff Unterwagner, who took the fifth spot in Evco last year; Tim Madden, who placed third; and Bill Lampe, second for the conference in 1973.

Assistant Coach (1st Year)

Teanah Trolio, who spent four years in the Wildcat volleyball program, begins her first season as CWU assistant volleyball coach this fall while she finishes her degree in art education.

Trolio was a three-year starter at outside hitter for Central from 1996-98. She served as team captain in '98 and played in every match. Trolio ranked no lower than fourth on the team in either kills or aces during each season of her career, and also was second-best in blocks in '96 and '97.

She reached career highs of 16 kills and 10 blocks during her sophomore season. She also recorded seven aces against Northwest College in an October 1998 match. An injury at the beginning of last season ended her playing days, but she remained involved with the team all year.

Trolio graduated from Evergreen High School (Seattle) in 1996 after an outstanding athletic career. She was a four-time letter winner in volleyball and softball, and played basketball for three seasons. Her leadership earned her four team captain awards - two in volleyballm and obe each in basketball and softball.

She was a three-year all-league selection at outside hitter, making first-team her senior year. As a center in basketball, Trolio captured second-team status in the 1995-96 campaign. She also earned first-team recognition as an outfielder.
