In 1983, CWU forfeited four games to Saint Martin's and withdrew from the NAIA national tournament after Saint coach Joe Meagher notified the Wildcats, prior to the District championship game, that Wildcat center Jerome Williams might be ineligible. The Saints never again beat a Dean Nicholson coached team, losing 16 straight, including a 122-66 decision in the "revenge" game before a sellout crowd the next season in Ellensburg. . .Except for the 1983 forfeits, the Saints have only once won back-to-back games against the 'Cats (1991-92) or back-to-back games at Lacey (1977-78) or Ellensburg (1980-81). CWU won 19 straight home games against Saint Martin's between 1932 and 1953. The 'Cats then put together a 29-game home-court win streak between 1957 and 1979. CWU won 14 straight at Lacey between 1979 and 1990 (though they

later forfeited two of the wins) and 10 straight between 1941 and 1950. . .The two teams have played three overtime games with CWU winning in double overtime at Lacey in 1942 and 1995 and in single overtime at Lacey in 1984. . .St. Martin's coach Bob Grisham is 5-26 against CWU, 2-14 at Nicholson Pavilion, 3-11 at the SMC Pavilion and 0-1 at neutral sites. CWU coach Greg Sparling is 9-1 against Saint Martin's, 6-0 at Nicholson Pavilion and 3-1 at Lacey. Sparling also coached two other games against the Saints in 1995 at CWU, losing 73-71 and winning 78-63, but officially Gil Coleman, who was hospitalized at the time, is credited with those two contests.

SPU coach Ken Bone is one of the few small-college coaches ever to have a .500 record against CWU. Bone is 7-7, including 3-4 against Greg Sparling. Bone was 4-3 against Gil Coleman. He never coached against Dean Nicholson, who compiled a 33-16 record against the Falcons. . .The teams have played four overtime games and CWU has won all four - in 1955 at Seattle and in 1975, 1992 and 1998 at Ellensburg. . .In games played at Seattle, CWU has won 23 of 45 games, though CWU forfeited its 1983 win giving the Falcons an official home-court record of 23-22 against CWU.

As members of the Evergreen Conference, CWU and WOU played home-and-home series between 1971 and 1978 and CWU won all 16. Even though there was no official conference schedule, the two teams met in 1984 and 1985 for the conference title. In the 1984 game at Monmouth, Jon Jordon, one of the top clutch shooters in school history, drilled a 22-footer at the buzzer to give the Wildcats a one-point overtime victory.

Home teams have won 62.3 percent of the games in the series between the Wildcats and Vikings. However, in the 1939-40 season, the visiting team won all four games. Forty-nine years later, the Home Jinx struck again as the visiting school swept all five games. . .Western lost 24 straight games at Nicholson Pavilion between 1973 and 1988 and the Vikings all-time mark in the Pavilion is 11-44. . .CWU officially has a 27-22 record (including one forfeit loss) at Carver Gymnasium, which opened during the 1961-62 team. . .In addition to putting together a 24-game home winning streak against the Vikings, CWU won 13 straight home games over WWU between 1928 and 1939. The Vikings won four straight at Ellensburg between 1924 and 1927. . .CWU won 10 straight games in Bellingham between 1928 and 1936 and six straight between 1989 and 1991. The Vikings' longest win streak against CWU at Bellingham is five between 1941 and 1943. . .Seven of the 214 games between the two schools have required overtime, with CWU winning five, including three of the four in Ellensburg. CWU has won four straight overtime games since WWU's last OT victory in 1985. Only one game has required more than one extra period, a 33-30 Western double overtime victory in 1927.
