MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES
STATE NORMAL SCHOOL
ELLENSBURG

May 2, 1932

Those present were Mr. Wm. M. Yesman, Mr. V. J. Bouillon and President R. E. McConnell.

The following items of business were considered:

1. The minutes of the meeting of February 17 were read and approved.
2. Salary adjustments for 1932-1933 were made as follows:
 - a. The Normal School staff was reduced upon the following scale:

\$3600.00 and above	10%
\$2500.00 to \$3600.00	7½%
\$2000.00 to 2500.00	5%
 - b. The Training School staff was reduced 5% on the yearly income, to be deducted from the nine months' pay.
 - c. Special cases:

Miss Elene Buhrson was placed in charge of the instruction of the home economics courses and raised \$20.00 a month, to a total of \$1680.00 plus board.
3. The position of superintendent of buildings and grounds was discontinued to take effect immediately.
4. The fourth grade teacher was discontinued beginning with the fall term.
5. Elections:
 - a. Harold Barto of Shelton was elected to be assistant coach and instructor in history at a salary of \$2400.00 beginning September 1.
 - b. Summer elections:

E. E. Samuelson,	\$550.00
Mae Picken	240.00
Stella Gronewald	200.00
6. President McConnell was given authority to secure a man for the head of the Music Department, to take effect in September, 1932.
7. The request for new linoleum for the kitchen in the President's home was granted.
