MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTERS WASHINGTON STATE NORMAL SCHOOL ELLENSBURG

March 26, 1935

- The Board of Trustees met in Ellensburg at the call of the President.
- Those present were Mr. V. J. Bouillon, Mr. R. C. Sinclair, Mr. H. E. Bolin, and President R. E. McConnell.
- The minutes of the meeting of December 12, 1954, were read, and approved.
- The salary adjustments as recommended by President McConnell were reviewed. MOVED by Mr. Bolin, SECONDED by Mr. Sinclair, that the salaries recommended be approved to take effect April 1, 1935. CARRIED.
- MOVED by Mr. Bolin, SECONDED by Mr. Sinclair, that the salary of President McConnell be raised to \$6000 a year beginning April 1, 1935. CARRIED.
- MOVED by Mr. Sinclair, SECONDED by Mr. Bolin, that a letter of appreciation for his worthy and fair support to this institution be sent to Governor Clarence Martin by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees. CARRIED.

The following appointments were approved:

- Mr. Vernon Carstensen, instructor in the History Department for the spring term of eleven weeks at \$50 a week, and for the first half of the summer of 1935 at a salary of \$357.50 for the six weeks.
- Professor W. T. Rolfe of the University of Texas to teach art the first six weeks of 1935 summer school, at a salary of \$450.
- The following leaves of absence without pay were granted upon the motion of Mr. Bolin and the second of Mr. Sinclair:
