Jerilyn S. McIntyre
University President
1st Year

Dr. Jerilyn S. McIntyre became Central Washington University's 13th president on July 1, 2000. McIntyre, 58, a 30-year veteran of teaching, research and leadership in higher education, served as interim president at the University of Utah during 1991 and 1997. She joined the Utah communication faculty in 1977, and served as associate dean of the college of humanities, associate

vice president for academic affairs and for more than seven years as vice president for academic affairs.

McIntyre received a Ph.D. in communications at the University of Washington in 1973, after earning a bachelor's degree in history and master's degree in journalism at Stanford University.

She is co-author of the textbook "Self, Symbols and Society: An Introduction to Mass Communication," published in 1984 by Addison-Wesley Company, and sole author of the instructors manual to that text.

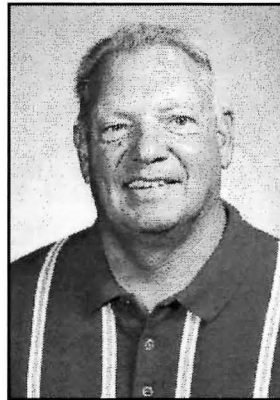
Her recent monographs and articles include pieces on accountability of the press, radical dissent and free speech, history of communication, and 19th century frontier communities.

In 1997, McIntyre won the Distinguished Woman Award from the Consociates Auxiliary of the Salt Lake City Assistance League, and in 1994 she was named Distinguished Woman of Utah by the Salt Lake chapter of the American Association of University Women.

Other recent honors for McIntyre include special recognition in 1998 for contributions to campus diversity by the U of U faculty affirmative action committee, and election to honorary membership in the Beehive, Owl, and Key, and Skull and Bones student honor societies.

She worked as an assistant professor of journalism at the University of Iowa from 1973 to 1977. Earlier, she worked as an assistant professor of mass communication at Chico (Calif.) State College.

McIntyre also has experience as a working journalist, starting as an editorial assistant with "Chemical Week" magazine, and going on to work as a correspondent with McGraw/Hill Publishing Company's world news bureau.



Jack Bishop
Director of Athletics
1st Year

Jack Bishop's most recent position was as the director of athletics at Southern Utah University in Cedar City.

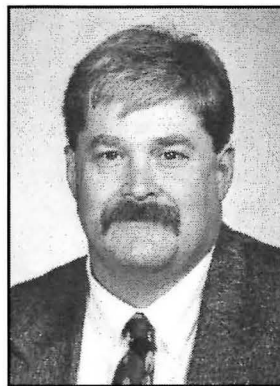
The winningest coach in Southern Utah football history, Bishop oversaw the advancement of the athletic program from NAIA to NCAA Division II and on to SUU's present classification at the NCAA Division I-AA level.

Born July 22, 1947, in Delta, Utah, Bishop participated in football and rodeo at both Ricks College and Southern Utah before receiving a bachelor of science degree in 1969. He completed a master of science degree at Utah State in 1980.

From 1969 to 1976, Bishop was one of Utah's most successful high school football, wrestling and track coaches. His Cedar City football team was regional champion in 1976. He coached two CHS teams to state track titles and won one state wrestling championship at Heber City's Wasatch High.

At the college level, Bishop served on the I-AA Executive and American Football Coaches Association Rules Committees. He is past chairman of the All-America Selection Committee. His veer option offensive philosophy has been published in the AFCA's summer manual.

Bishop is a supporter of high school and little league sports.



Lyndon Wieseman
Assistant Athletic Director
1st Year

Lyndon Wieseman left his position as the athletic development officer at Dakota State University to move to Ellensburg.

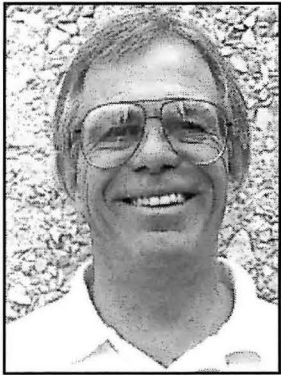
Wieseman, who also served as a geography instructor at DSU, earned a bachelor of science degree from South Dakota State in 1985 and master's degrees from SDSU in geography and in athletic administration from Wayne State (Neb.). He has done doctoral studies in higher education at the University of Nebraska.

Prior to his arrival at DSU, Wieseman was assistant athletic director for external development at Wayne State from 1988 to 1996.

Wieseman is a 1979 graduate of Osceola (Neb.) High School where he was a quarterback and all-state linebacker. He was a two-time AAU high school national qualifier in the javelin. He played football for two seasons at South Dakota State before injuries ended his career.

Wieseman has a wide range of experience in athletic administration, including sports information, game program design, public address announcing, advertising, marketing, promotions and ticket sales. While at Wayne State, he established the school's sports radio network.





Gary Smith
Athletic Trainer
33rd Year

Gary Smith, 62, has been the athletic trainer at CWU since 1968. He began his 33rd season with the Wildcats this fall.

Smith, a past president of the NAIA Athletic Trainers Association, is a member of the NAIA, Northwest Trainers Association, and Central Washington University halls of fame.

He was elected for meritorious service and was inducted into the NAIA Hall-of-Fame in March, 1985. He was only the second trainer so honored. Smith was inducted into CWU's Hall-of-Fame in 1991, and the Northwest Trainers Association Hall of Fame in March, 1998.

A member of the NAIA Medical Aspects committee, Smith has worked at national championship events in baseball, wrestling and track-and-field and at the Hula Bowl football game.

He was on the medical staff for the World University Games in Bulgaria in 1978 and for the Cup of Nations tournament in Bogota in 1974. Smith also spent two weeks working at the Olympic Development Camp in Colorado Springs, Colo., in the summer of 1987.

Smith was born July 27, 1938, at Charlevoix, Mich., and graduated from Charlevoix High School in 1956. After a stint in the military, he attended North Central Michigan College, earning an associate of science degree in 1962.

He then enrolled at Northern Michigan University and was granted a bachelor of science degree in 1964. He received his master's of science degree from Indiana University in 1965.

He played football and track in high school, earning all-conference honors in football. He also lettered in track at Northern Michigan.

Before accepting his position at CWU, he was head trainer for Punahou High School in Hawaii for three years.

Smith and his wife, Elizabeth, were married in 1961. They have two adult children - Julie Marie and Michael Allen.



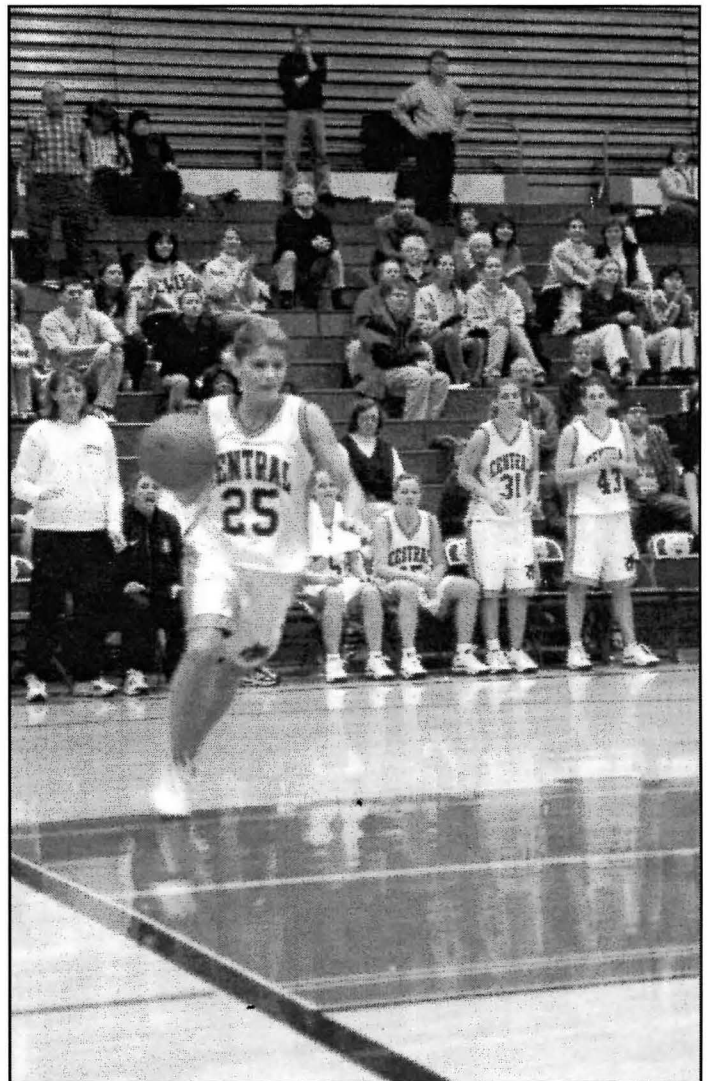
Erika Anattol

COMMENTS FROM CWU HEAD COACH JEFF WHITNEY

Whitney on...

EXPECTATIONS AFTER A SUCCESSFUL 1999-2000 CAMPAIGN:

"We take things in strides. We have a new team. We lost three players that I think are pretty key. But I do think that we filled those spots. It is going to depend on how those three players step in and help us. Obviously we would love to get back to the national tournament. We want to hang the PacWest banner here, but we've got ten other teams that are biting on our heels. It is going to be a tough league. If we can survive the challenges we have a pretty good shot."

RETURNEES:

"I think **Kristen Willis** is an All-American guard. She doesn't score 25 points a night but without her we wouldn't have had the success that we had last season.

I think **Rose Shaw** is going to be one of the finer posts in the league. She's strong, physical, has added more moves to her game and is more confident.

Meggen Kautzky was our starting two guard last year. She has a ton of talent. She is still learning our system and how good she can be. I think we are going to see a lot of good things out of her.

Jenny Dixon has been playing very strong in the pre-season. We thought if Jenny came ready to play this season and healthy then she was going to be the key that is going to make us successful."

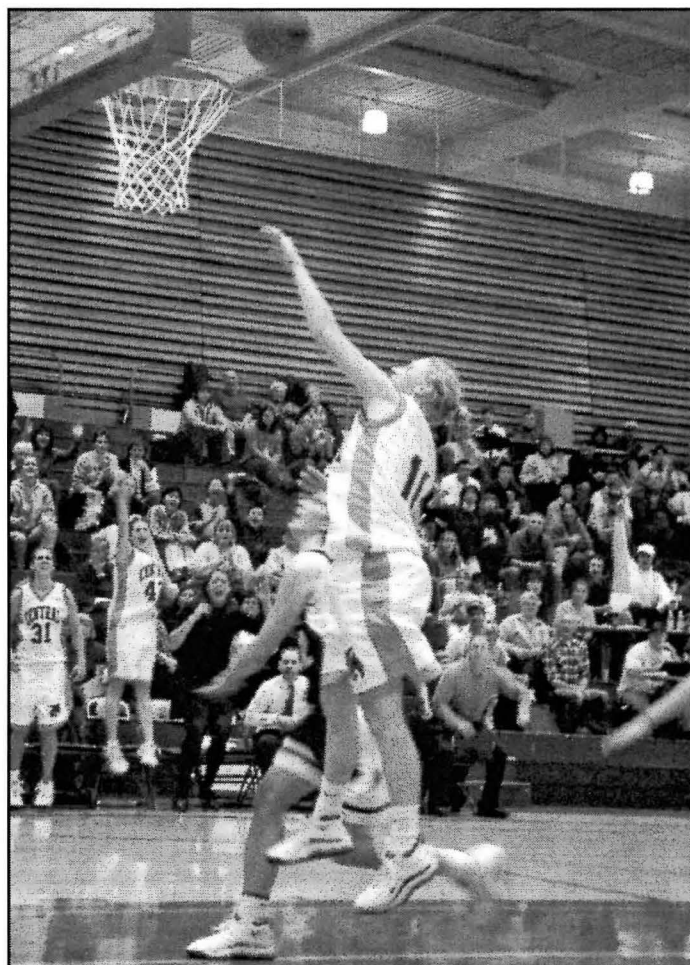
NEWCOMERS:

"**Karie Pruet** is real athletic and can shoot the three. We were very fortunate to get her in the late signing period. She is a J.C. kid who is experienced and ready to go. She is very smart, can pass the ball and fits real well into our system.

Dawnita LiaBraaten can just flat out shoot the ball. She is learning how to defend, and will make key contributions to our success.

Karen Causseaux is going to be a real good ballplayer for us.

Kelsey Ellis' athleticism will give her the opportunity to get some minutes this season. She has the potential to have a bright future at Central."



AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT:

"Our depth. The good teams in our league are deep. We have been hurt by injuries the last couple of years that have allowed us to play only six, seven, eight kids. Right now we have ten and if they stay healthy, that makes us a much better team.

Offensively, we need to be more consistent putting the ball in the basket. That means taking better shots.

What coach wouldn't say rebounding? We've consistently finished toward the bottom (of the league). We have not been a real big team in the past."

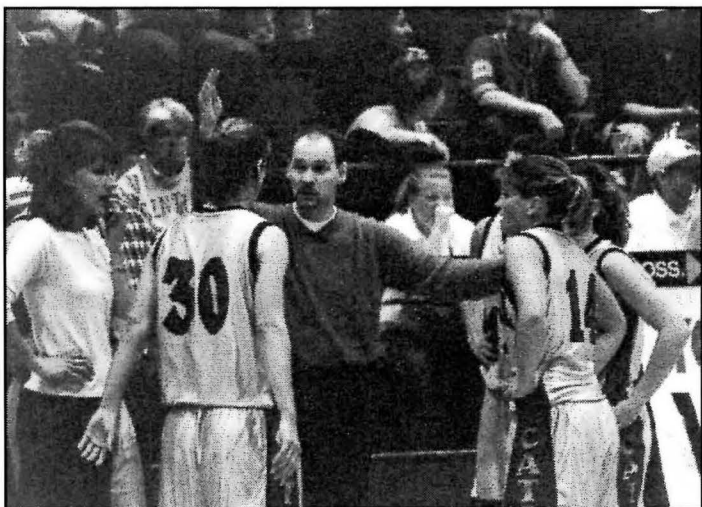
STRENGTHS:

"Our returning players, because they know the system.

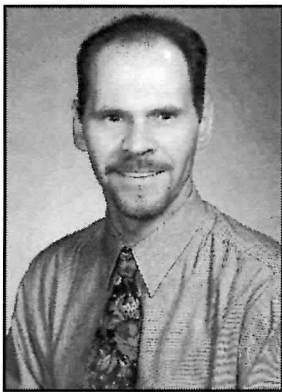
We all know from day one that we preach defense around here and opponents in our league know that we play defense."

PACIFIC WEST CONFERENCE:

"The coach's picked Seattle Pacific first, Central second, Western Washington third, Anchorage fourth and Billings fifth. This cast went to the national tournament last year. They all got better and didn't lose a lot. I think Western Oregon, St. Martin's and Alaska Fairbanks are three teams that return almost everybody plus they all got some good recruits. We're talking about eight teams that realistically have a great shot at winning the PacWest Conference. That is pretty rare. The survivor is going to be an awfully good team."



CWU COACHING STAFF



Jeff Whitney
Head Coach
4th Year, 43-37

Jeff Whitney, who guided CWU to its first playoff win in 10 seasons in 1997-1998, recently topped that by guiding his 1999-2000 team to the NCAA Division II National Tournament. This was the second national tournament appearance for the Wildcats and the first NCAA appearance in school history. The last appearance came in 1988 when Central was in the NAIA.

Whitney was selected the 1999-2000 PacWest Coach of the Year.

In Whitney's three years as head coach, the Lady Wildcats have reached the playoffs three consecutive years. Whitney's teams have broken more than 19 statistical school records since his appointment. He has graduated all of his players over the last eight years while serving as an assistant and head coach.

Whitney, a 1995 graduate of Central Washington, earned a bachelor of science degree in recreation management with an emphasis in business management.

Prior to assuming the position of head coach for the Lady Wildcats, Whitney was the head assistant coach for five seasons at CWU. Whitney served as the interim head coach during the 1997-98 season and was named the permanent head coach in 1998.

In 1985, Whitney earned an associated of arts degree from Olympic College, where he played basketball two seasons. Whitney earned NWAACC honorable mention all league selection as well as being a coach award winner.

A 1981 graduate of South Eugene High School in Oregon, Whitney was a multi-sport athlete playing basketball, football and tennis for the Axemen.

From 1984-86, Whitney served as the assistant girl's basketball coach at North Kitsap High School. During his tenure, North Kitsap posted a 67-8 record and was the 1985 WIAA AA state champions. Whitney helped the Vikings to three consecutive state tournament appearances.

Misc: Born in Yakima. Married. His wife, Katrina, a former standout player at Seattle University, is the director of CWU's Center for Student Empowerment. The couple have a son, Treyvn.



Karla Hawes
Assistant Coach
3rd Year

Karla Hawes begins her third season as assistant coach for the Wildcats. In her previous two seasons, Hawes helped guide the Lady Cats to three consecutive playoff appearances, including a national tournament appearance last year. This was only the second National Tournament appearance for the Lady Cats and the first at the NCAA level.

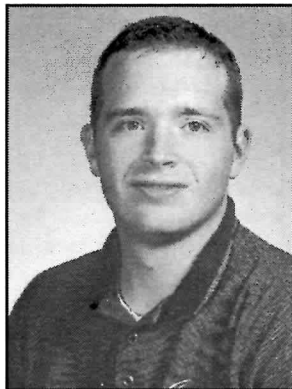
Hawes, a 1995 health and physical education graduate, recently completed her master's degree in athletic administration from CWU. From 1990-1994, Karla started four seasons for the Wildcats and is the school's No. 3 all-time leading scorer with 893 points. She also ranks sixth in rebounding (503) and fourth in assists (225) on CWU's all-time career charts. She twice was voted the team's Most Valuable Player and honorary team captain. She was also selected the team's best defensive player during her junior season and earned Pacific Northwest all-region honors her senior year.

Hawes is a 1990 graduate of Goldendale High School, where she lettered in volleyball, basketball and track. She earned all-state honors in basketball and volleyball.

Hawes' coaching career started as CWU's junior varsity coach during the 1994-95 season while completing a degree in health education. After graduation, she was an assistant varsity coach in volleyball and basketball at Issaquah High School for one season. She then taught health and physical education and was the girl's head basketball coach at Eisenhower High School in Yakima, Wash.

Misc: Born in Bremerton. Single. Family includes yellow lab, Kally. Spent six summers working on a helicopter wildland fire fighting crew.





Tyce Nasinec
Assistant Coach
1st Year

Tyce Nasinec, a starter on three CWU conference championship basketball teams from 1996-1999, joins the women's coaching staff this winter.

Nasinec completed his four-year career in the 1998-99 season as the sixth leading scorer in school history with 1,457 points. He also is CWU's No. 2

all-time leader in three-pointers made (198). He ranks third in career steals (187) and fourth in assists (325) and is the only non-point guard ranked in the top five in assists.

Nasinec, 24, graduated from Rogers High School in Puyallup in 1995, where he lettered in football and basketball. In football he played quarterback and safety and was voted Rogers team captain and defensive back-of-the-year.

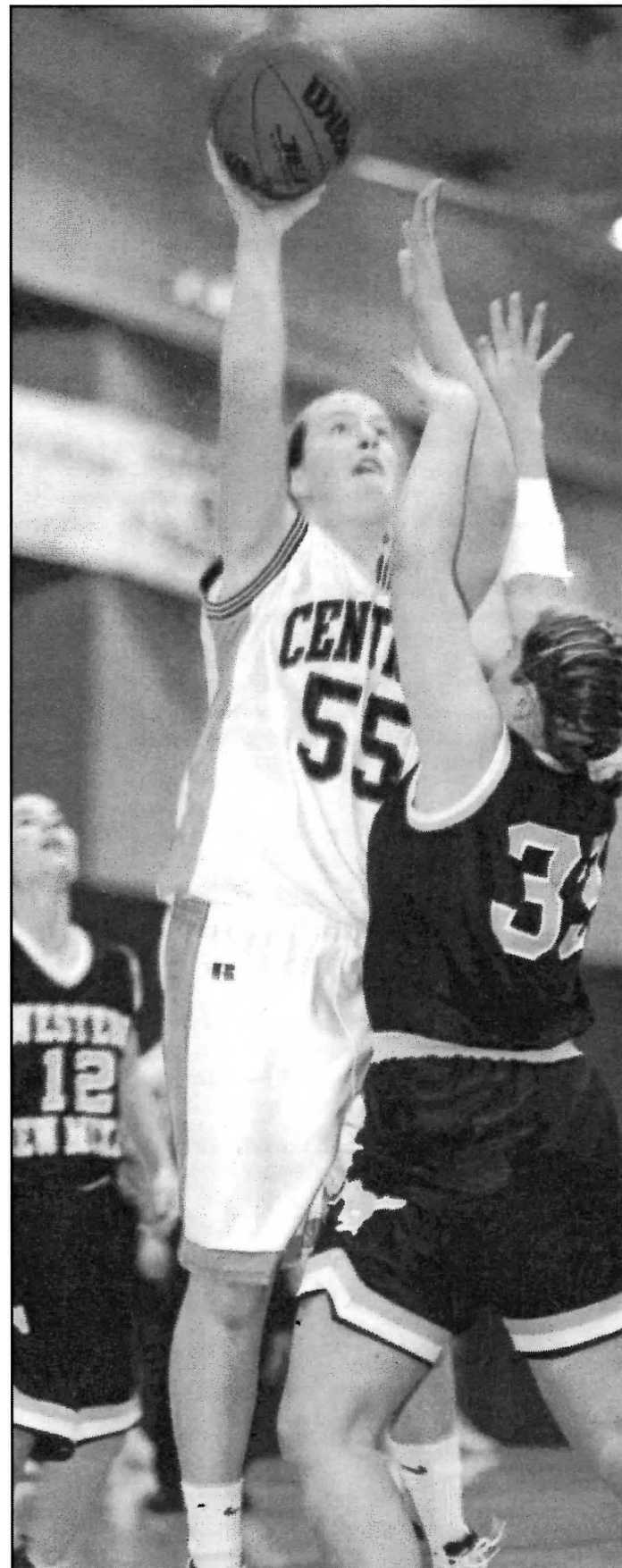
In basketball, he averaged 23 points per game and earned second team all-state honors.

After playing significant minutes in his freshman season at CWU, during which he averaged 6.6 points and 2.4 rebounds per game, he moved into the starting lineup and averaged 12.2, 16.6 and 14.3 points per game during his sophomore, junior and senior seasons.

Nasinec earned Pacific Northwest all-conference honors and was a NAIA honorable mention All-American during his junior season. He earned PacWest first-team all-star honors in 1999.

He won a total of six different team awards, including Most Valuable Player, during his career. He was a three-time co-captain. He also won the Ken Broches Coaches Award his freshman season and the Willie Strange Hustle Award in his sophomore campaign.

Misc: Born 6-22-76 at Seattle. Has two brothers.

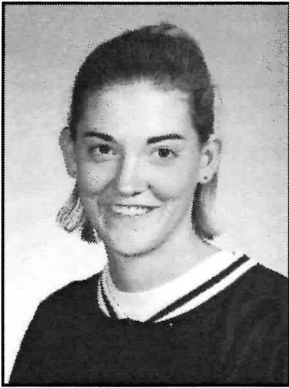

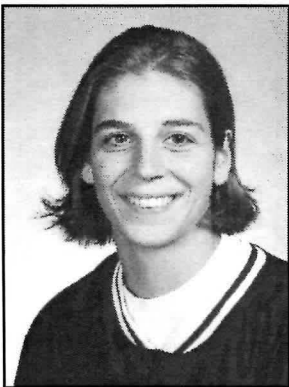
CWU PLAYER PROFILES

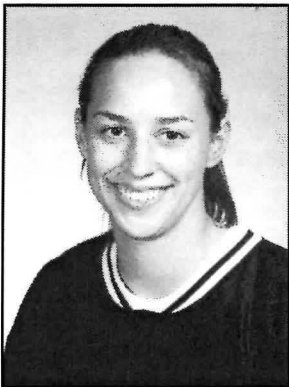


JENNY DIXON

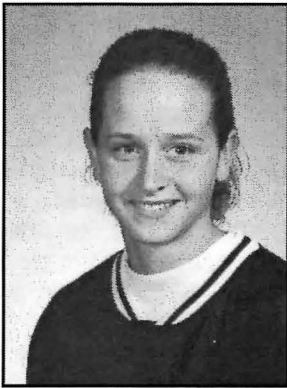

Guard, 5-10, Fr., Langley - South Whidbey

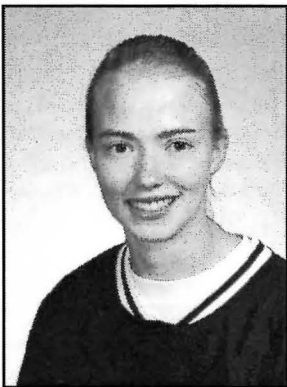

Guard, 5-7, Jr., Longview - Clark CC

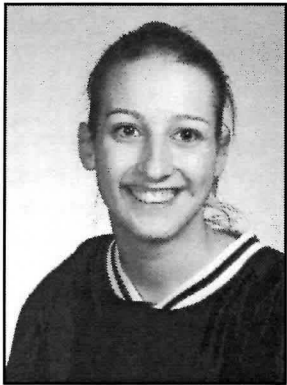

Center, 6-1, Jr., Yakima - Eisenhower

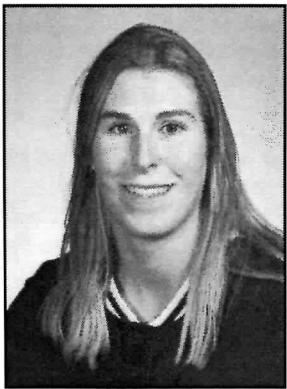
