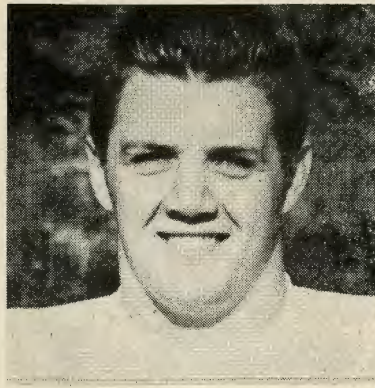

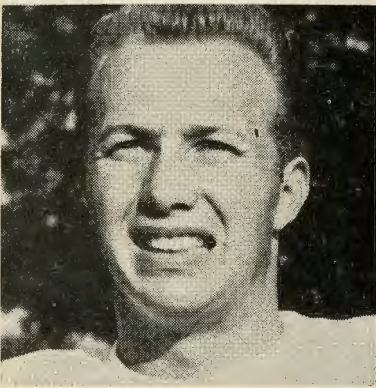

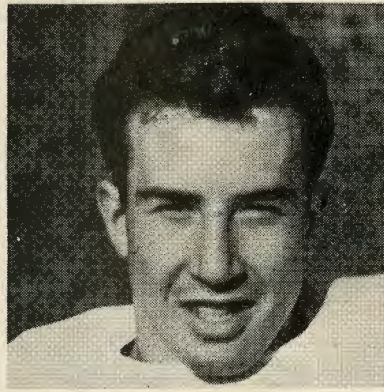

Key backs have also missed action in earlier games due to injuries. They watched the Gladiator team outrun, outpass, outgain, and just plain outplay P.U. The Lutes couldn't beat the weather, though, and the "big win" seemed to ooze through their fingers on the rainswept gridiron.

The cheering fans who clustered near the fifty-yard line at Bellingham last week saw the weather again betray the PLC squad. Again the statistics were in their favor, but one drive after another bogged down in the muck of a baseball diamond that was a sad excuse for a football field.

The Evergreen Conference race tightened during the past week with ties and losses counting as much as wins. The Lutes must win their Homecoming game today to keep alive their conference hopes.

Last year Corky Bridges ran wild and the Little All-American back scored thirty points as Central defeated PLC 45-13. John Jacobson passed for both Lute tallies and should prove to be a major pawn in the Gladiator attack today.



**Conference Race**

As predicted in the season's first program, the Gladiators have proven themselves much stronger than was forecast by conference sports scribes. The Lutes have rolled up an average of 265 yards per game, 146 rushing and 119 passing, to completely dominate the conference in total offense. They have scored 34 points, while allowing conference opponents only 16.

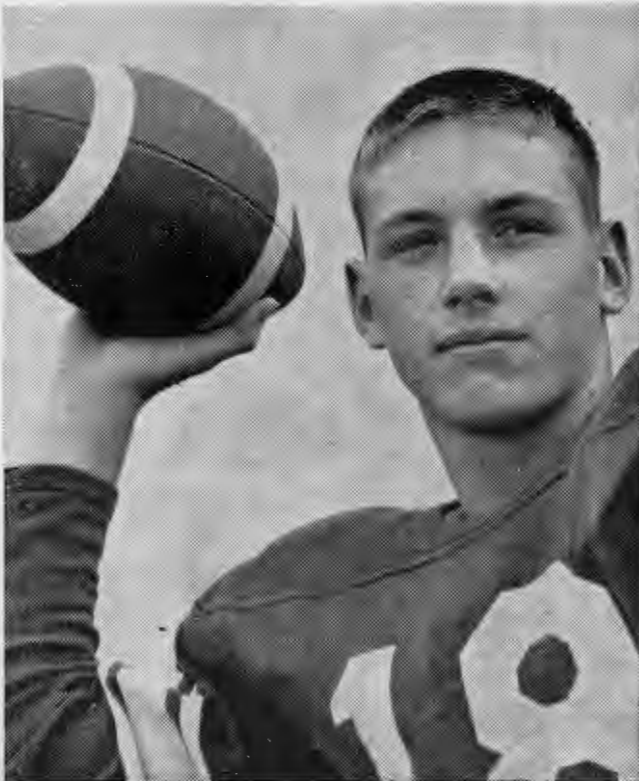

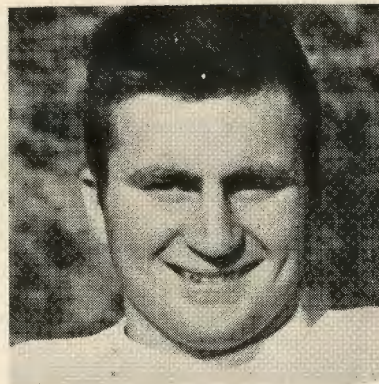
