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Statement from Hung Nguyen

1. On Dec. 1988 (3rd phrase), The Joint Commission Team (Vietnamese and American) headed by Mr TRAN-VAN-TU and Mr. GARNETT BELL, were arrived this region to looking for the witnesses, but nobody knew neither incident nor when it happened! The local government only knew the airplane was shot down but can't indicated exactly time, location and the fate of the missing airmen.

2. On Jan. 1989 (4th phrase), The Joint Commission Team come back and investigate again (by Mr. LAI-VAN-CATIEU and Mr. JAMES COYLE), but again it was also unsuccessful.

3. On Aug. 1989 (7th phase), Mr. NGO-HOANG and Mr. GARNETT BELL is charge and investigate again. They arrived in scene and found several pieces of airplane relate to the Case#132 but no trace about the fate of the airmen.

4. On Feb. 1991 (13th phase).
The Joint Commission Team come back again at village PHUONG-TRACH, district BS-TRACH; but once again, they can not found anything, no evidence no landmark relate to the incident. But in the file of the 4th Military Regional noted that "There were 2 dead pilots buried at the landmark kilometer #54, on the local road #20". Both Team were came to the indicated area, but they can not find any vestige either..

(C) 5. On May 1992 (17th phrase), they coming back again in R&O-BAT hamlet, but no furthered new information relate (Team leaders were Mr. NGÔ-HOANG and Mr. JAMES COYLE).

6. On Jan. 1994, Mr. PHAM TÙO and Mrs ROSS JAMES LEE of PCIT looking for what unit of Army stationed when the airplane shot down, but nothing knew about it.

7. On Nov. 1994 (32nd phase), the SRT leading by Mr. PHAM CÔNG KÌM and unknown... (the American Team leader) came back and interviewe some one, but predicated nothing as all.

8. On May 1995, Mr. PHAM TÙO and Mrs JAMES M. COYLE interviewed with Mr. HUỲNH-VĨGIŪ - who knew something about RIA - residency at village YÊN-BAI, district TỈNH-YÊN, province THÀNH-HÓA, he was an ex-reporter of VN Press (New-Agency), he took 2 pictures of 2 pilots, whose dead at THƯỢNG TRẠCH, QUANG-BÌNH in 1968, and wrote in the back of pictures: "MORRISON and FRANCISCI" and he released some information: He heard some one said that the Artillery Regiment of Mr. NGUYỄN-VĨT XVÂN was shot-down F4 C, 2 pilots were parachuted, the Lt. wounded his leg. At that time in the scene, there were only soldiers and some organization (TNXP); they

of the volunteer gunner. But immediately, the airplanes of USAF arrived and bombardment so hard,

(D) the LT. and some soldiers were -- upon two, the pilot buried far from the local road #20, about 10 to 15 meters at the landmark kilometer #54. On Nov. 26, 1968, when Mr. Huu Nghi coming to the buried place, he requested to desinter the corpse so he can take a picture. At last, the pilot reburied in the same grave --

In the morning on Nov. 26, 1968, the fighters of USAF arrived and bombing, they hoped to rescue the pilots. At this moment, the soldiers encircled ^{and too close} they called him to surrender, but the pilot fired back, killed one soldier and some youths. At last, the pilot was ~~be~~ killed (Major Morrison).

After Major Morrison died, Mr. Huu Nghi took a picture and come back to his unit, he did not attend the buried.

IV. Proposition.

This is a complicate and difficult case, because the airplane was downed in the place no transportation, the trail was perilous, dangerous terrains and deep forest, no inhabitants, there are only military units camped in several days, stop and go. So that, the only one man: Mr. Huu Nghi, he knew something.

- To propose pick-up Mr. Hir-NGOR, escort him to the Land mark (kilometer # 54) at the local road #2 so he let we know and indicate (if he remember) the site was buried. If not, the file of this case will be close.
