## FOREWORD

■ The 1963 HYAKEM's theme is Growth, Progress and Development here on Central's Campus. ■ Central Washington State College had a higher enrollment than ever before in 1962-1963 with a total of 2650 students attending fall quarter. Men's dorms were overcrowded and facilities were inadequate until the New Men's Dorm was completed section by section and finally completely occupied. ■ Problems arose with Central's New Commons but soon, with all of the grills and equipment installed, the food lines moved with ease. ■ The new additions to the Classroom Building and old library will soon be completed and students may go to classes without hearing hammers, drills, and saws. ■ Yes, Central is developing, funds are being raised by the SGA for carillon bells that will be played on the hour, keeping uniform time on campus. These should be installed next fall. New dorms are already on the drawing board. 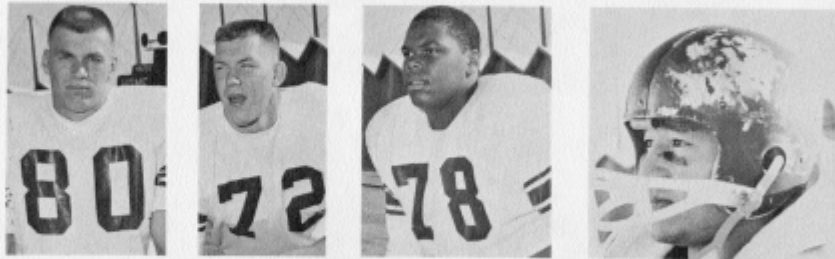
## FOOTBALL

■ Central's hoopsters enjoyed a winning season this past winter with 14 victories against 10 losses. The Cats had an eight win, three loss non-conference record, a four win, six loss record in conference play, and won two, lost one in the annual Evergreen Conference Tournament. The Cats finished fourth in the league race and won third place in the tournament. ■ Coach Leo Nicholson's squad started out the season with eight wins in its first 11 games. However, injuries and scholastic difficulties hit the squad at the end of the first quarter. Dale Hall, Harold Riggan, Jim Clifton, three starters, were out with injuries during much of the league competition. The Cats seemed to rebound as the season neared its end; the three returned to action, winning five victories in their last seven games.

■ The honorary captain award went to Harold Riggan. Most inspirational player award was given to Jim Clifton. Ron Olney was given the "Mr. Hustle" award.

■ The leading scorer was Olney who averaged 13.7 points a game. Riggan was next, hitting for an average of 12.8 points per game. Olney led the squad in the rebounding department collecting 255. Brad Wilson was next in line with 192.

■ With Wilson being the only senior on the squad, the prospects for next year look bright. Central's entire starting unit of Olney, Riggan, Clifton, Hall and Maawad will be back along with Roger Buss and Jerry Cote who, along with Wilson, led the reserve strength.

■ Coach Leo Nicholson completed 34 years of coaching at Central this past season. He has also served as football coach, track coach, and tennis mentor during his many years on the Central campus.

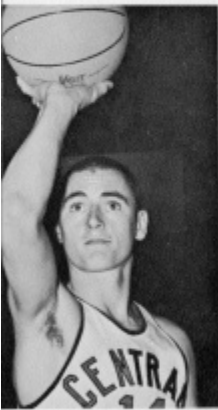

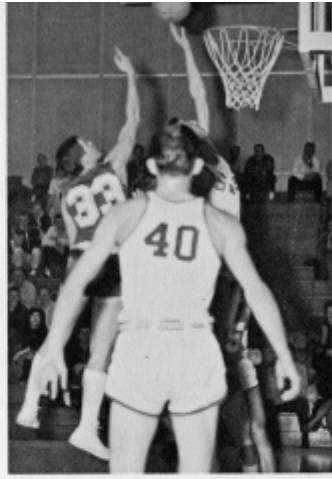

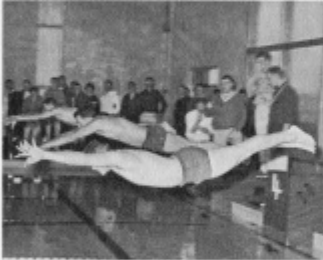

In the annual Evergreen Conference Swimming Meet, the Cats swam to second place. Pacing the Central Swimmers were Trent Janas, who amassed 96.75 points during the season. 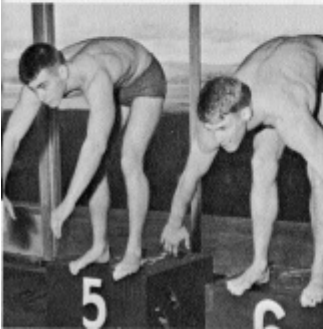

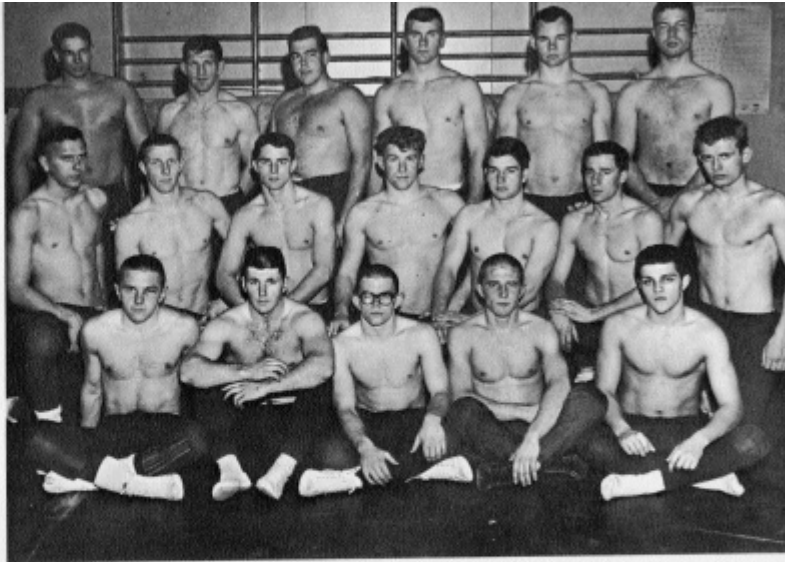

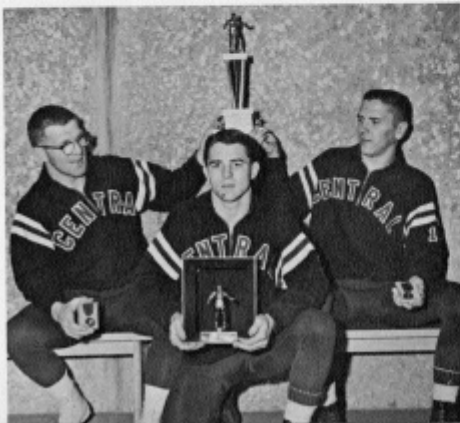

WRESTLING

Central's wrestlers won the state wrestling championship among the colleges and universities in Washington state this past winter. To add frosting to the cake, the Wildcats placed third in the annual Pacific Coast Wrestling Tournament. Gerald George, Central's fine sophomore, was the Pacific Coast champ in the 147 pound class. Ken Salyer and LeRoy Johnson finished in the runner up positions in their weight divisions, and Don Parham placed fifth in the heavyweight class. Coach Eric Beardsley's grapplers ended the regular season with nine victories, three losses, and two ties, for the best record in the three year history of the sport at Central.

The highlight of the regular season was the Cats' 16-11 victory over the University of Washington Huskies when over 1800 fans swarmed into Nicholson Pavilion to witness the event. The consensus was that it was a bigger crowd than the Pacific Coast Wrestling Tournament draws to its annual event. Central had faught to a 15-15 draw with the Huskies earlier in the season in Seattle to mar the Cats' otherwise perfect record against every college in Washington state.

Overall, the Cat wrestlers won 90 matches, lost 46 and faught to seven draws. When one considers the competition Central faced, this record is particularly outstanding, and is a compliment to Coach Beardsley's fine skill and the effort put forth by the wrestling team. Central was led by freshman Joel Burke, who won 16 matches and lost one. George followed Burke with 10 wins, one loss, and one draw. With Salyer the only senior on the squad, the outlook is very bright for next year.

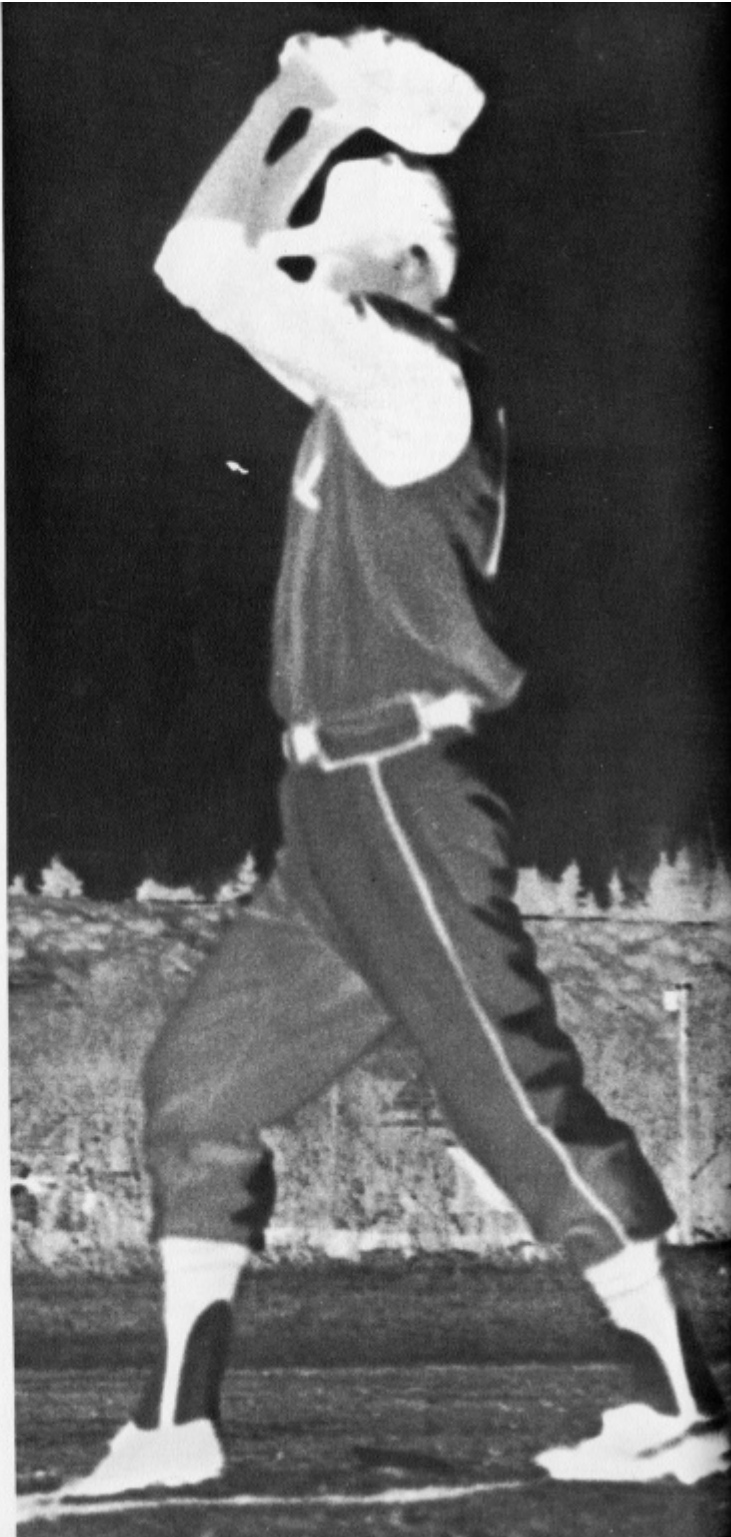


Displaying trophies from the Pacific Coast Meet are: Ken Salyer, Gerald George, and LeRoy Johnson.

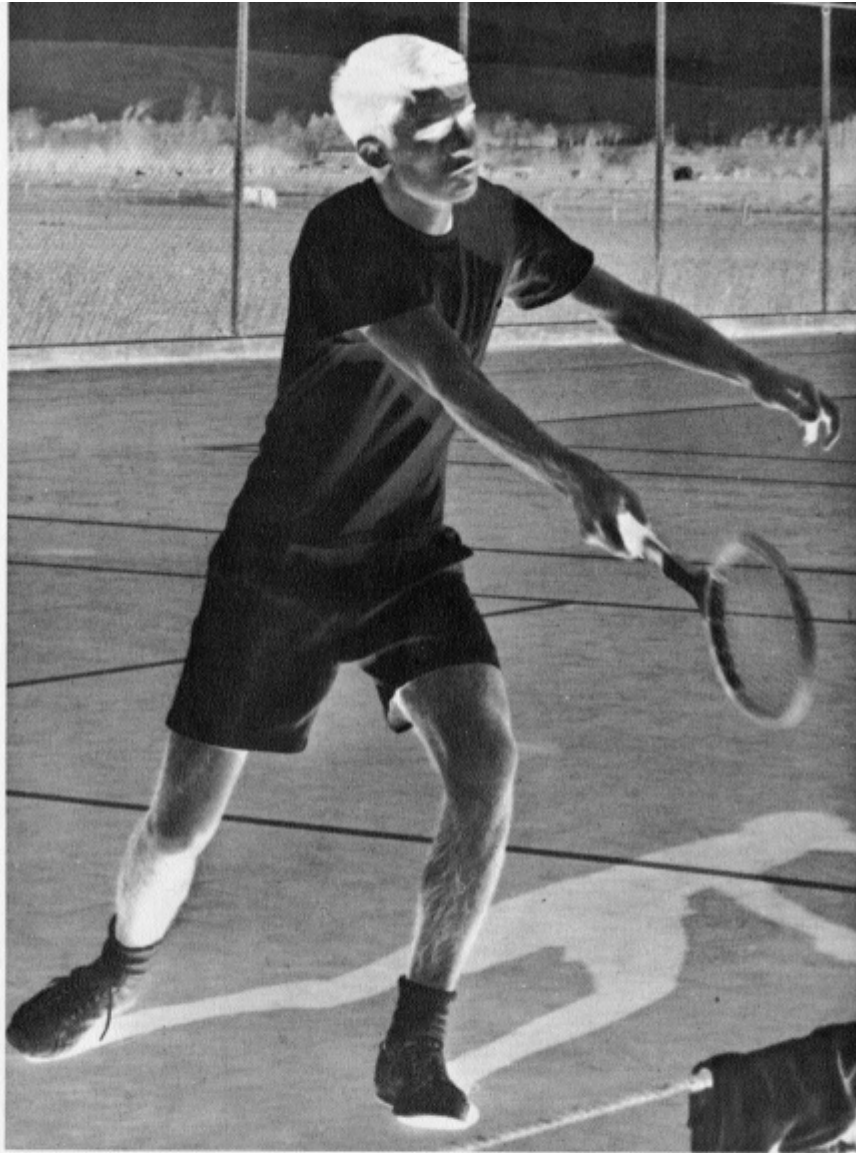

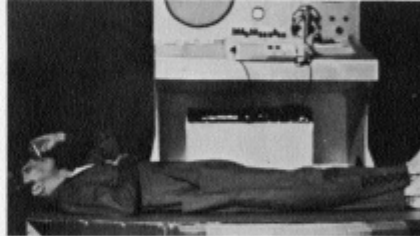

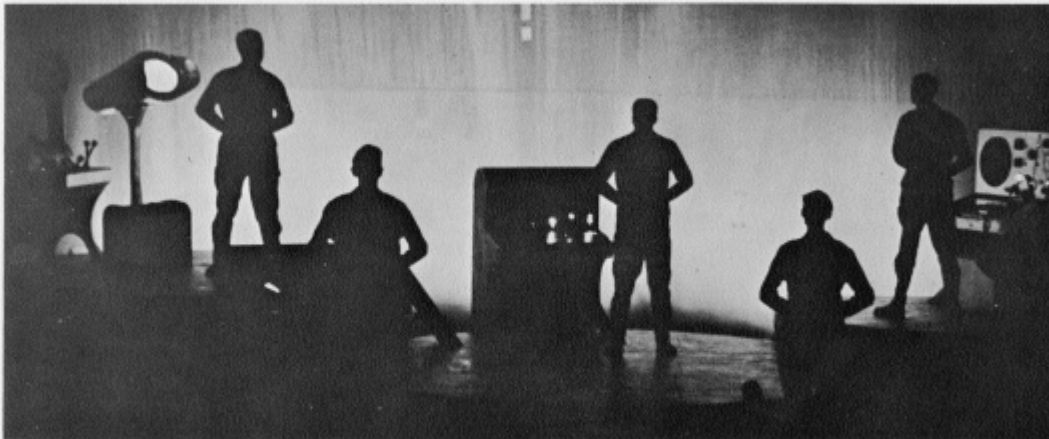


### "NIGHT OF THE AUK"

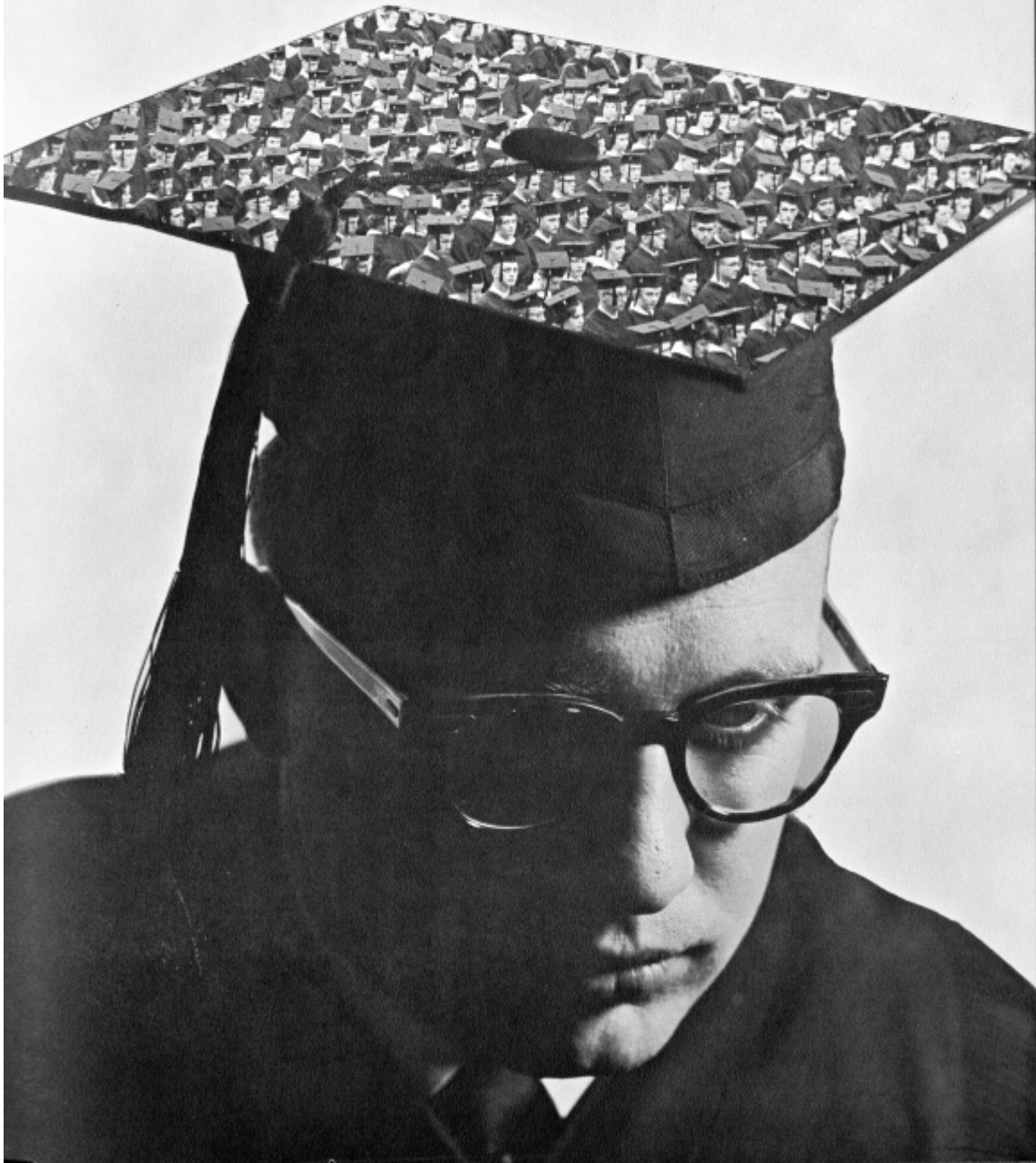

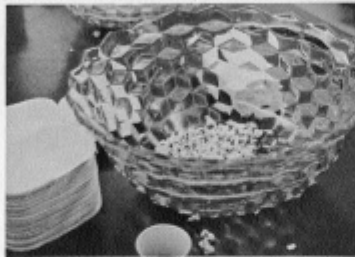






## SGA ELECTION

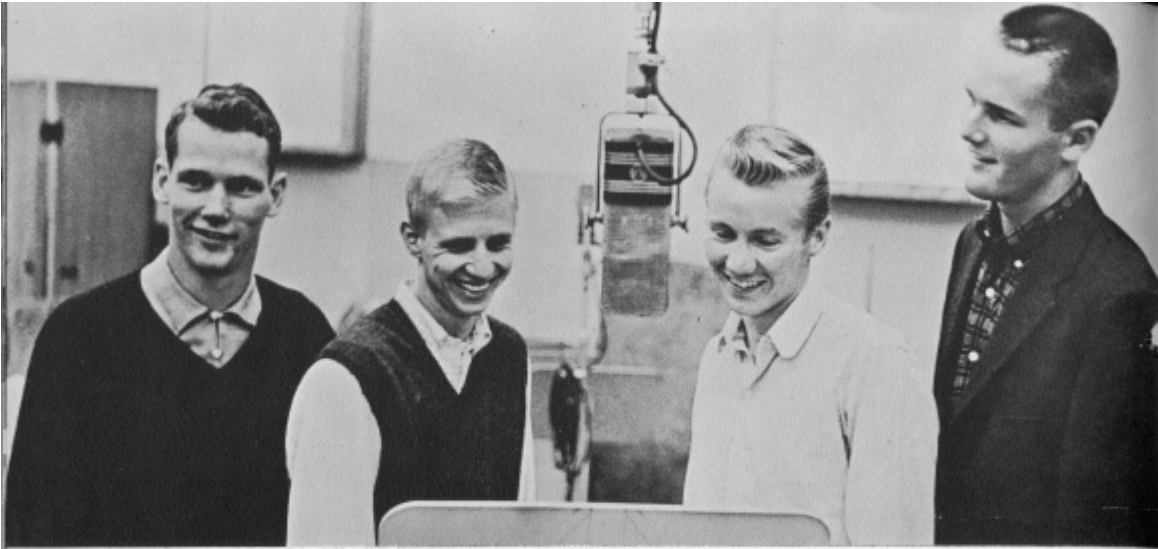

#### THE FOUR PREPS

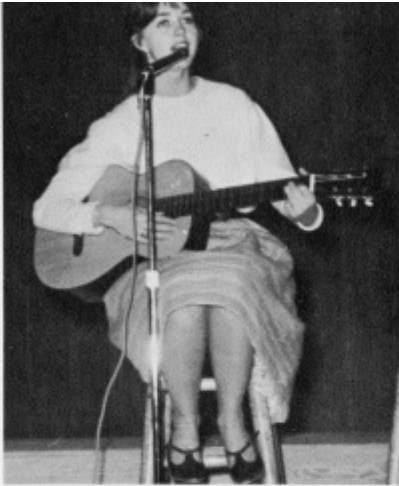
