FACTS ABOUT CENTRAL

LOCATION: In Ellensburg, Washington, a city of 13,000 centrally located in Kittitas County, 105 miles east of Seattle, 36 miles north of Yakima, and 175 miles southwest of Spokane. Other nearby cities are Wenatchee, Ephrata, Moses Lake and Pasco-Kennewick-Richland (Tri-Cities).

CONFERENCE: Evergreen Conference - NAIA

ENROLLMENT: 7,000

TEAM NICKNAME: Wildcats

SCHOOL COLORS: Crimson and Black

ATHLETIC FACILITIES: Nicholson Pavilion (seats 4, 200) is site of varsity basketball and wrestling events. The Pavilion has a six-lane, regulation 25-yard swimming pool, handball courts, large intramural sports and dance area and field house. Tennis courts, baseball field and large intramural fields are adjacent to the Pavilion. Additional tennis courts are near dormitory areas. Modern physical education instructional equipment is available throughout the Pavilion. Tomlinson Field (seats 4, 200) is site of varsity football, and located behind the Pavilion. The 440-yard track (with 220-straightaway) rims the football field.

HISTORIC FEATURES: Washington State Normal School was established by the first Washington legislature in 1890 and the school opened in 1891 with four faculty members and 86 students. The physical makeup for the campus at that time was occupancy of the second floor of the Washington Public School.

Presently Central has 64 buildings spread over 218 acres. The estimated worth is more than \$30 million. In 1953 the legislature authorized the College to grant the B.A. degree. In 1937, it became Central Washington College of Education. The legislature authorized B.A. degrees in Arts and Sciences and the Master of Education degree in 1947. In 1961, the name was changed to Central Washington State College. CWSC is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education and the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools. Too, it has been approved by the United States Attorney General as an institution for non-quota immigrant students. Master of Arts and Master of Science degrees are now offered in music, art, psychology, biology, English, history, mathematics, and chemistry.

THE EVERGREEN CONFERENCE

Organized in the fall of 1948, the Evergreen Conference is beginning its 22nd year of athletic competition. With a reputation for being one of the top small-college circuits on the West Coast, its member institutions, although all in the State of Washington, draw athletes from all parts of the United States and western Canada.

The Evergreen Inter-Collegiate Conference, as it is officially known, is the outgrowth of the six-team Washington Inter-Collegiate Conference which was disbanded in favor of the present set-up. Central Washington State College was granted membership in the new league along with Puget Sound, Western Washington, Pacific Lutheran, Whitworth, Eastern Washington and St. Martin's.

Eventually the University of British Columbia entered the league on a trial basis but withdrew in 1958. St. Martin's dropped football with the outbreak of the Korean War and also withdrew its membership in the league.

Throughout the years, the Evergreen Conference has been one of the strongest organizations in the Northwest. However, in the spring of 1964 the group momentarily tottered on its foundations as charger member Pacific Lutheran University announced its withdrawal from the Conference in favor of the Northwest Conference. University of Puget Sound followed suit in January, 1967.

Coach Gary Frederick came to Central after coaching football and baseball at Thorp (1959-60), Waitsburg (1960-63) and Central Kitsap (1963-67) high schools. Frederick's high school record in football was 36 wins, 17 losses and 2 ties.

Having played four years of varsity football at Central (1955-59), Frederick came well equipped when hired to be assistant football coach and head baseball coach. Playing offensive center and defensive linebacker while at Central, Coach Frederick was selected as All-Evergreen Conference (1957-58). Gary was coached by Abe Poffenroth and Adrian Beamer, both still at Central.

In the past two years since Coach Frederick has taken over as head baseball coach, Central has compiled a record of 48 wins, 22 losses and 2 ties. The Wildcats have won:
