Averaged 9.60 strikeouts per nine innings, but also walked nearly 1 per inning (40 in 45), and finished with a 8.00 ERA. Pitched two-hitter in 8-3 complete-game win over Whitworth Feb. 27. Struck out 14 in six innings in loss to Puget Sound on Mar. 6. Won final two games, including four-hit complete game win over St. Martin's on Apr. 30. In final three appearances, allowed just four earned runs in 13 1/2 innings. Misc: Born 3-9-79 at Bremerton. Undecided on major. Has one sister (Melissa Jo), who played JV basketball at CWU. Posted 3.70 GPA in high school. Was recipient of \$500 Grange Scholarship. Bats - R. Throws - R.

SCOTT EARLE (6-3, 171, Jr., Puyallup - Rogers & Tacoma CC)

High School: Graduated from Rogers High School in 1995. Lettered in basketball (2) and baseball (3). Played point guard in basketball. Second team all-league. Team captain. Pitcher and shortstop in baseball. Twice earned all-league honors. Had 19-1 career mark and 1.10 earned run average. Was selected Tacoma Athletic Commission Player-of-the-Month. College: Played one season at Tacoma CC prior to enrolling at CWU. Posted 4-6 won-loss record. Tied CWU school single-season record sophomore season with 11 victories. Record held by former major leaguer Dave Heaverlo. Also led team in saves (3), innings pitched (88.1), strikeouts (79), earned run average (2.65) and complete games (8). Started season as closer before being moved into starting rotation. Ironically longest appearance of season was 8 1/3 inning relief stint against Whitworth on Mar. 9. Tied school records for most wins, most appearances (21) and most batters hit with pitch (13). Struck out 79, including season-high 11 in 7-6 win over Eastern Oregon on Apr. 23. Completed eight games - one short of school mark - in 10 starts. Four of 11 wins came against St. Martin's, including five-hit shutout on Apr. 19. Beat nationally-ranked Albertson 7-5 on Mar. 29. . Won team-high six games this spring, including two wins over Lewis-Clark State. Struck out 83 batters, including 10 or more three different times.

Had career-high 12 strikeouts against Puget Sound (Mar. 21) and Whitman (Apr. 29). Three of five losses came against eventual NAIA national champion Albertson. Broke own school mark by hitting 20 batters. Ranks sixth in career wins with 17 and fourth in career strikeouts with 162. Has two of the top five single-season strikeout totals in school history. Ranks among CWU Top 10 career leaders in 15 different pitching categories, including wins, complete games (5th, 14), innings (7th, 168), official at bats (4th, 653), hits (6th, 175), doubles (6th, 25), triples (3rd, 5), home runs (5th, 17), runs (9th, 102), earned runs (7th, 84), strikeouts, wild pitches (8th, 16), hit batters (1st, 33), stolen bases allowed (8th, 27) and sacrifices off (2nd, 21). Misc: Born 8-6-76 at Puyallup. Public relations major. Has two sisters. Had 3.20 GPA in high school. Bats - R. Throws - R.
