LEON JOHNSON
 Forward, 6-7, 195, Sr., Seattle

High School: Graduated from Ingraham High School in 1991. Lettered in football (1) and basketball (2). Played quarterback and wide receiver in football. Played center in basketball. Twice all-league. Team Captain, MVP and top rebounder in basketball. Averaged 18 points, eight rebounds, three assists and three blocks senior season.

Junior College: Played two seasons at Edmonds CC. Twice all-league. Inspirational award winner and Best Defender. Averaged 12 points, five rebounds and three blocks per game.

At Central Washington: Sat out two seasons after earning all-conference honors during 1994-95 season for CWU. Averaged 17.1 points and team-best 6.6 rebounds in final 25 contests, starting 24. Scored 20 or more points nine times, including 23 and 25 in two national tournament games. Also had 20 rebounds in two tourney games. Season-high 28 points against Seattle Pacific on Jan. 24. Season-best 13 rebounds against The Master's (Calif.) on Mar. 16. Set school-record by blocking nine shots against Lewis-Clark State in PNWAC championship game on Mar. 7. Finished season with 60 blocked shots, second best total in school history. . .Earned second team All-American honors last winter leading Wildcats to Pacific Northwest Athletic Conference title and into Elite Eight round at NAIA national tournament. Was voted PNWAC Player-of-the-Year. Also named to Little All-Northwest team. . .Led conference in scoring (20.6), steals (70) and blocked shots (66). Ranked second in conference in field goal percentage (61.1) and rebounding (7.3). . .Finished career ranked among CWU all-time leaders in five categories - scoring (17th), scoring average (3rd), field goal percentage (3rd), steals (8th) and blocked shots. Moved into Top 10 in six single-season categories this past winter - 10th in scoring, sixth in scoring average, fourth in field goal percentage, seventh in free throw attempts, ninth in steals and second in blocked shots. . . . Is very athletic. Has excellent court speed for a post player.

Misc: Born 1-21-73 at Seattle. Has two brothers and one sister. Uncles (Michael Timmons and Calvin Anderson) played football and track at Central Washington and Yale, respectively.
