# Central's Past:



## Leo & Dean Nicholson: 1,114 Wins

Central Washington University is in its fourth season as a member of NCAA Division II after a 60-year association with the NAIA.

The Wildcats have qualified for the Division II national tournament three straight years and earned the top seed and host role for the West regional in 1999. Central, the first school outside the state of California to host the regional since 1988, lost to Cal State - San Bernardino in the semifinals. The Coyotes then defeated Seattle Pacific in the regional final.

Prior to joining the NCAA, CWU was the winningest team in the history of the NAIA national tournament with 46 victories. Central also held NAIA records for most appearances (27) and consecutive appearances (9 between 1974 and 1982).

CWU has won a total 34 regular-season conference titles, including eight Tri-Normal, two WINCO, 12 Evergreen, six NAIA District 1, three PNWAC and two PacWest West Division crowns. The Wildcats won the NAIA District 1 post-season championship 24 times and three times won the PNWAC tournament. In 1999, they earned their lone PacWest post-season title, defeating Hawaii Pacific 76-56 in the title game.

In 94 seasons, CWU teams have won 1,452 games and lost 765, a winning percentage of .655.

Leo Nicholson coached 505 victories in 33 seasons (1930-64) winning nine conference championships and one district title. Leo's son, Dean, won 609 games in 26 seasons (1965-90) winning 14 conference and 22 district crowns. Dean, with 38 victories, is the winningest coach in the history of the NAIA national tournament.

The Nicholsons are the winningest father-son coaching combination in the history of collegiate basketball with 1,114 victories. The historic 1,000th win came on Dec. 12, 1986 when CWU defeated Northwest Nazarene 76-71 in a tournament at Whitworth College.

Dean joined his father in the exclusive 500 victory club on Jan. 6, 1987 when the Wildcats stopped Pacific Lutheran 70-53 at Nicholson Pavilion.

In district, regional and conference playoff competition, the 'Cats have won 77 games and lost 27. CWU won 19 straight district playoff games between 1976 and 1982.

CWU's best finish at the NAIA national tournament came in 1970 when it placed second and Dean Nicholson was selected the NAIA National Coach-of-the-Year. The 'Cats also finished third in 1967, 1969, 1987 and 1989 and fourth in 1985. CWU reached the quarterfinals of the NAIA national tournament in seven of its last nine appearances.

First team NAIA All-American honors have been won by four CWU players - Mel Cox in 1967, Paul Adams in 1970, Rich Hanson in 1973 and Jason Pepper in 1993. Twenty other players won second team, third team or honorable mention honors.

In 1987, Ron vanderSchaaf, who was named to the second team, was selected in the seventh round of the NBA draft by the Los Angeles Lakers.

CWU has had three coaches or administrators inducted into the NAIA Basketball Hall-of-Fame. Leo Nicholson was honored in 1964. Perry Mitchell, a long-time CWU administrator and former university president, was selected for his general contributions to NAIA sports. Dean Nicholson was inducted to the hall in 1986. Dean was also named to the NAIA's 50th anniversary all-star team in 1987.

Two Wildcat players have been tapped for special NAIA national tournament honors. Dave Benedict won the Charles Stevenson Hustle Award in 1967 and Dave Allen won the same award in 1970. The CWU team won the coveted James A. Naismith - Emil S. Liston Sportsmanship award in the 1967 tournament and again in 1989.

## **The Leo Nicholson Award:**

In 1971 a group of Ellensburg businessmen purchased a trophy to be presented each year to the top small-college basketball team in the Pacific Northwest.

The trophy is awarded to the school determined to be the outstanding team by a panel of sportswriters, broadcasters and sports information directors, who also select a Coach-of-the-Year.

The award honors the memory of the late Leo Nicholson, who won 505 games at Central from 1930 to 1964.

Central, under the direction of Leo's son Dean, has won the award 10 times and the younger Nicholson was voted the Coach-of-the-Year three times. Gil Coleman won the Coach-of-the-Year award posthumously in 1995.

"It is going to be a dogfight with the likes of Western Washington, Seattle Pacific and Humboldt State. There is not going to be a night off in this league."

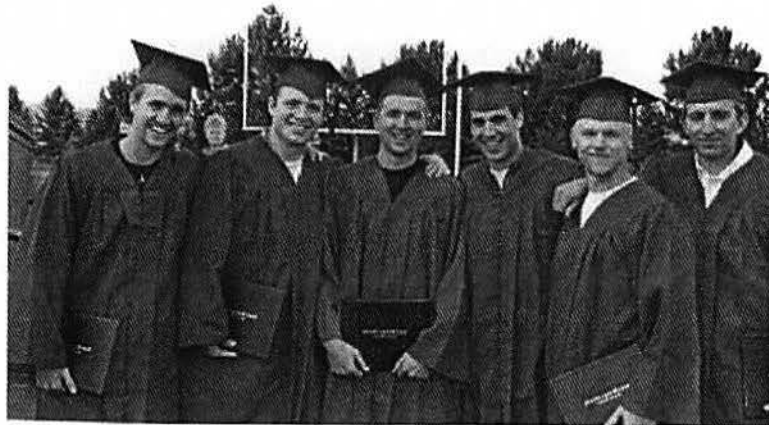
"The talent level continues to get better and better."

# CWU Coaching Staff

## **GREG SPARLING**

Head Coach (7th Year, 117-62)

In just six seasons, Central Washington University head basketball coach Greg Sparling has compiled an impressive record.

Sparling, who reached his 33rd birthday only last summer, became the third coach in school history to reach the 100-win plateau with a 74-69 victory over Virginia Union on November 17, 2000. He joined the legendary father-son coaching combination of Leo and Dean Nicholson in that exclusive club. Sparling has four conference titles and four conference Coach-of-the-Year awards to his credit.

In his first six seasons, Sparling has compiled a record of 117-62, winning 65.4 percent of his games. Last year he guided the Wildcats to a record of 18-10 and a No. 6 ranking in the West Region in their third season at the NCAA Division II level.

Last season, Sparling guided CWU to the NCAA Division II West Region semifinals, beating Seattle Pacific in overtime, 101-95, on the way.

Sparling has made three trips to the NAIA and NCAA tournaments. In two of those appearances, CWU won two games at the NAIA national tournament in Tulsa to reach the quarterfinal round after coming into the tournament unseeded. Central knocked off Incarnate Word (Tex.) and Azusa Pacific (Calif.) in the 1996-97 NAIA tournament, and stunned Union (Tenn.) and Olivet Nazarene (Ill.) the following year.

In three trips to the NAIA nationals, including the 1994-95 season when he took over after the death of Gil Coleman, Sparling led CWU to five victories.

A 1993 graduate of CWU in art with a minor in art history, Sparling was an assistant to Coleman for three seasons.

He replaced Coleman after Gil became ill in February, 1995 and guided the Wildcats to a 6-4 record, including a 2-1 mark after being officially named the interim coach upon the death of Cole-



man on March 6.

Under Sparling, the Wildcats posted a 15-15 record in his rookie campaign, reaching the semifinal round of the PNWAC playoffs where they lost to regular-season champion Seattle University. He then led the 'Cats to 18-11 and 19-13 seasons in their final two years at the NAIA level.

The CWU mentor, who coached CWU's junior varsity in 1991-92, was the Wildcat co-captain in his senior season when he averaged 9.0 points and 5.7 rebounds. He also blocked 26 shots and was one of the team's top three-point shooters, converting on 36 percent (18 of 50) of his attempts from outside the arc. Twice he was selected CWU's Inspirational award winner.

Sparling played two seasons at Highline Community College after graduating from Juanita High School in Kirkland before transferring to Central.

At Juanita, where he played under Coleman, Sparling earned three letters in basketball and won second team all-league honors. He was the team captain and Most Improved award winner in his senior season.

At Highline, he was a NWAACC all-star in his sophomore campaign and was twice voted the team captain. He was also the Inspirational award winner in his sophomore season.

Misc: Born 6-4-68 in Seattle. Has two brothers, one of whom (Don) played in Kansas City Royal baseball organization. Married Kristin Lesparance, a former CWU track-and-field athlete, in Aug., 1995. They have two sons, Coleman Michael, 4, and Jacob Arthur, 2.

## **KEITH COOPER**

Assistant Coach (2nd Year)

This will be Cooper's fifteenth season coaching basketball. Cooper got his start under former Wildcat mentor Gil Coleman at Juanita High School, where he was an assistant for two years. Cooper then went on to the community college level where he served as an assistant at Shoreline Community Col-



lege for two seasons. From there, Cooper moved on to Pacific Lutheran University where he was an assistant for four years.

Cooper got his first head coaching job at Decatur High School. He guided the Gators to five post-season appearances, finishing with a 75-54 overall record. Decatur appeared in three 4A state tournaments under Cooper, finishing second in 1996. Decatur also won the West Central District Championship that year. Cooper was named "All-Area" Coach of the Year in 1999. Before his successful coaching career began, Cooper played college basketball at the College of the Siskiyous and Tacoma Community College.

Misc: Graduated from Morton High School in 1982. Graduated with a Social Studies degree from Seattle Pacific University. Got his masters at PLU in Athletic Administration. Been married to wife Linda for 12 years. Linda is SPU's all-time leading scorer. They have one son, Keith Owen, who was born May 24, and a three-and-a-half-year old chocolate lab named Eddie Bow Wow.

### **TYCE NASINEC**

Assistant Coach (3rd Year)

Tyce Nasinec, a starter on three CWU conference championship basketball teams from 1996-1999, returns for his third season as an assistant coach under Sparling.

Nasinec completed his four-year career in the 1998-99 season as the sixth leading scorer in school history with 1,457 points. He also ended up as CWU's No. 2 all-time leader in three-pointers made (198). He also ranks third in career steals (187) and fifth in assists (325) and is the only non-point guard ranked in the top five in assists.

Nasinec, 25, graduated from Rogers High School in Puyallup in 1995 where he lettered in football and basketball. In football he played quarterback and safety and was voted Rogers' team captain and Defensive Back-of-the-Year.

In basketball, he averaged 23 points per game and earned second team all-state honors.

After playing significant minutes in his freshman season at CWU during which he averaged 6.6 points and 2.4 rebounds per game, he moved



into the starting lineup and averaged 12.2, 16.6 and 14.3 points per game during his sophomore, junior and senior seasons.

Nasinec earned Pacific Northwest all-conference honors and was a NAIA honorable mention All-American during his junior season. Last year, he earned PacWest first-team all-star honors.

He won a total of six different team awards, including Most Valuable Player, during his playing career. He was a three-time co-captain. He also won the Ken Broches Coaches award his freshman season and the Willie Strange Hustle Award in his sophomore campaign.

Misc: Born 6-22-76 in Seattle. Married Gina Guetle August 11. Has two brothers.

### **GE COLEMAN**

Assistant Coach (2nd Year)

GE played at Onalaska High School, where he was a three-year letter winner. Coleman helped lead OHS, coached by former Wildcat assistant Dennis Bower, to the state tournament three times.

The Loggers enjoyed a number one state A ranking during Coleman's junior and senior seasons, both of which he served as Onalaska's captain while earning awards as the team's best hustler and most inspirational player. He is a sophomore at Central this year and hopes to be a head coach in the future.

Misc: Born 1-6-82 in Chehalis. Son of former Wildcat coach Gil Coleman. Mother Teresa lives in Onalaska. Has one brother, Riley, 7, who lives in Redmond.

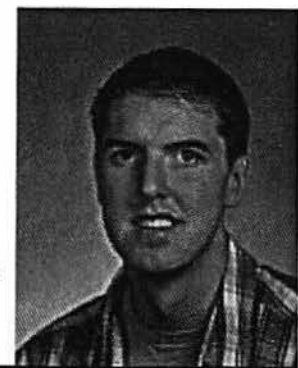


### **MATT MCDONALD**

Assistant Coach (1st Year)

After a successful year as a Wildcat player, Matt McDonald will move to the bench this winter to assist the CWU coaching staff.

Matt played in



---

25 games last season and started 14. He averaged six points and five rebounds per game and led the squad by making 62 percent of his field goal attempts (57-92) and blocking 15 shots. His best all-around effort was a 10-point, 18-rebound performance against Northwest Nazarene Jan. 27.

McDonald is a 1996 graduate of Mt. Tahoma, where he competed in basketball, tennis and baseball. He played basketball for two seasons at San Jose City College and one at Idaho State before coming to Central.

Misc: Born 6-7-78 in Tacoma. Has one brother and one sister. Will complete work on a Bachelor of Arts degree in general studies with an emphasis in coaching and sport management at the end of fall quarter.

### **JUSTIN PARKER**

Manager (2nd Year)

Justin graduated from Lakeside High School in 2000. He played three years of varsity basketball and football, and two years of varsity soccer. Justin was a member of the National Honor Society and was an ASB officer at Lakeside.

Parker plans to major in History at CWU and wants to become a teacher and coach college basketball.



### **ROBERT LOWERY**

Wildcat Radio Director  
(15th Year)

Robert Lowery, 45, is in his 15th season (11th consecutive) as Central Washington University's Director of Wildcat Radio.

Along with serving as play-by-play announcer for CWU football and men's basketball broadcasts, Lowery helps secure external funding for the broadcast program, the proceeds of which benefit the university's athletic scholarship fund and athlete recruitment.

Lowery, who also serves as CWU's media relations officer, is a 1984 graduate of Washington State University, where he received the Keith Jack-

son Award for excellence in sports broadcasting.

He has previously been the radio voice for WSU women's basketball and baseball; Green River Community College (Auburn) men's basketball; high school football and basketball, including Eisenhower and Davis high schools, in Yakima, and Pullman High School; and the Spokane Fury semi-pro football team.

Lowery also served as radio broadcast talent and tournament broadcast service producer for the NAIA Men's Basketball National Championship tournaments in Kansas City, Mo., and Tulsa, Okla.

In addition, he was Assistant Tournament Director of the NCAA Division II West Regional Men's Basketball Tournament, hosted by CWU, in 1999.

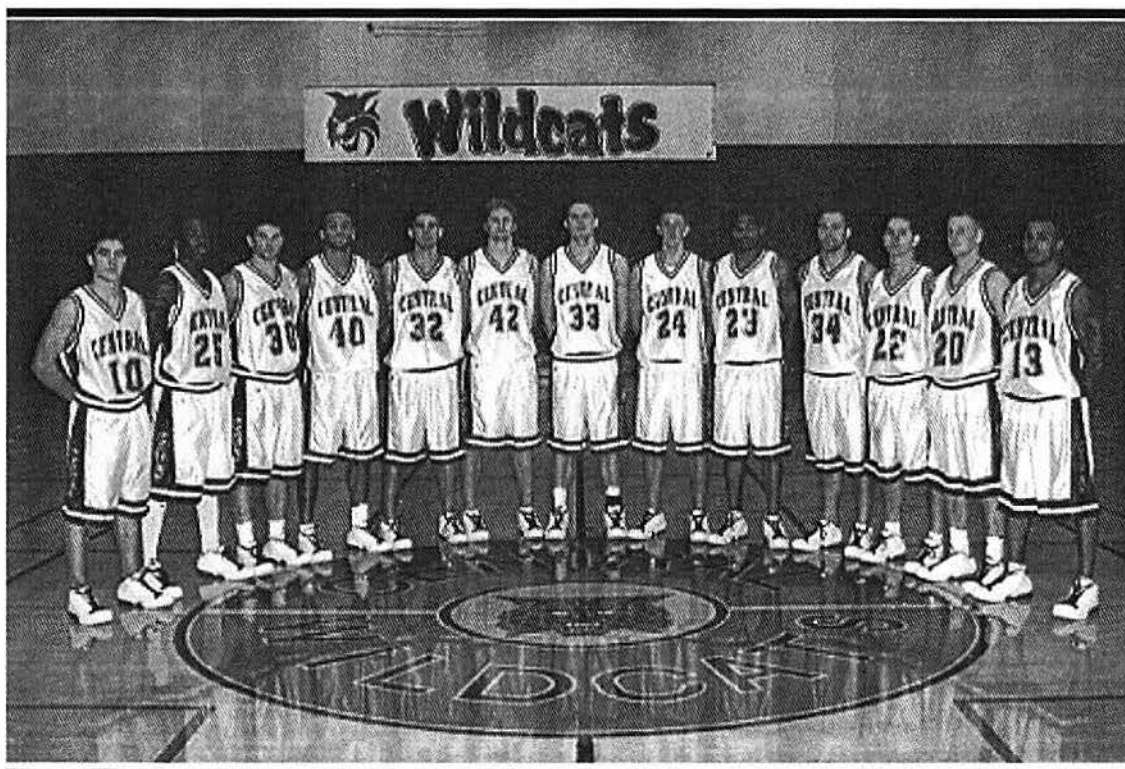
Lowery was also named CWU's Civil Service Employee of the Month for July, 2001.

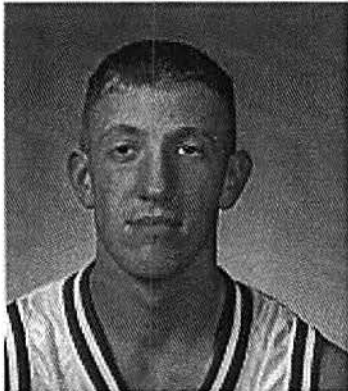

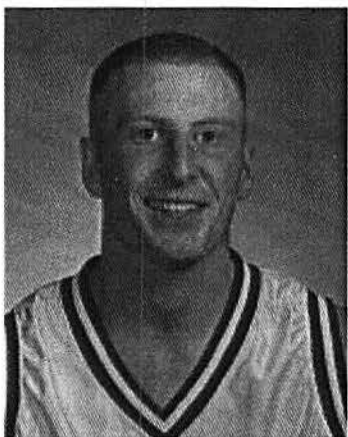
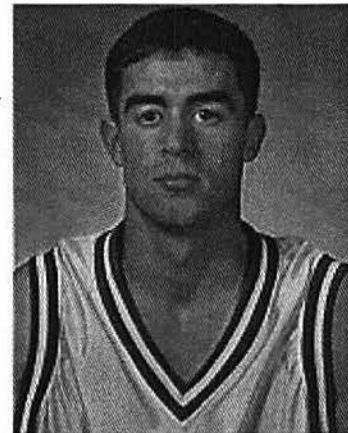
**GABE BOWNS**

He earned three varsity letters as a track and field participant and won 1999 state titles in the long jump, triple jump and 100-meter dash. He also won the triple jump a year earlier.

Northern Region's first team. He connected on 34 percent of his three-point attempts and 80 percent of his free throws. Helped lead Whatcom to last season's NWAACC Tournament. Very athletic. 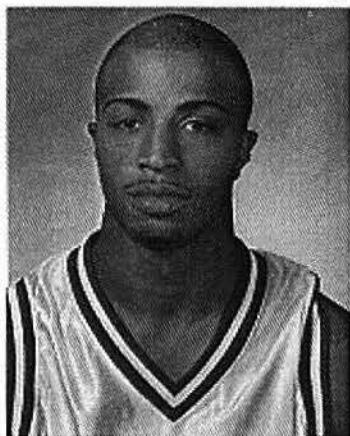
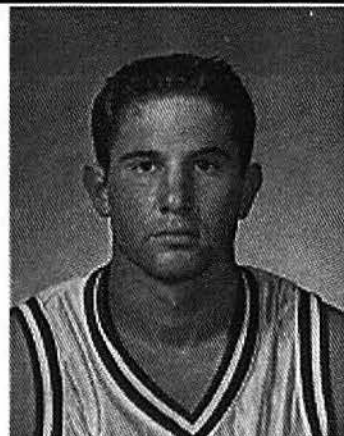
**SHANE KERNEN**

Guard, 6-3, 195, Jr., Vancouver-Battle Ground/Clark Community College

High School: Graduated from Battle Ground in 1999. Selected to the Greater St. Helen's League first team his senior season while scoring 12.7 points per contest. His resume also included per-game averages of 3.1 rebounds, 2.5 assists and two steals. The all-Clark County, team captain and most inspirational honoree holds the Battle Ground record for highest field goal percentage in one game. Kernen made all 10 of his attempts in a game against Hudson's Bay on January 7, 1999. . Served as football team captain and was a two-time all-league wide receiver.

College: Two-year letter winner at Clark. Was a first team all-NWAACC selection and averaged 20 points, 5.7 rebounds and 3.9 assists per game in his sophomore campaign. Helped the Penguins reach the NWAACC tournament this past season. Exciting player to watch. Can score inside and out and is a solid rebounder.

Misc.: Born 4-17-81 in Vancouver. Scholar-Athlete. Member of the National Honor Society while at Battle Ground. Named to the Columbian newspapers "Dream Team." Recipient of the National Football Foundation Award for achieving a 3.79 GPA.

**BJ LETCHER**

Guard, 6-1, 185, Jr., Kansas City, Kan.-Manhattan/Olympic Community College

High School: Graduated from Manhattan in 1998. Earned three letters in basketball. Part of Manhattan squad that won the 1996 Kansas 6A championship. Team placed at state his senior season. Averaged 17 points and six assists during that campaign and was second team all state.

College: Played guard at Olympic Community College from 1998-00. Joined forces with current Wildcat Sam Moore during 1999-00 season when Rangers finished fourth in NWAACC championships. Averaged 17 points sophomore year. Very athletic and quick player.
