and assistant in basketball. He is a 1939 graduate of the University of
Washington, but he attended
Central two years and
starred in baseball and
basketball.

He was an instructor at Central, before entering the navy in 1944, in the Army Air Force college training program.



Before coming to Central he ran up an enviable record in the Portland, Oregon, prep circuit. His Franklin high school teams copped the city championships in all three major sports in 1943.

Since Central started competing in baseball in 1948, Faust's teams have won two Evergreen pennants. Last year, with no official league competition, the Vildcats won only 4 while losing 10.

PROFILES (by position)

CATCHER ---

ANDERSON, Pete-a 5-11 junior who caught a year of ball at GraysHarbor college as well as two in Hoquiam High School; a smart catcher, but weak with the stick.

BORRESON. Wes-got his previous experience with Everett high school and EJC: was second string with Centrla last year; good on backstop and has plenty of power when he connects.

ARMSTRONG, Dick--a trnasfer from St. Martin!s; didn't pitch last year because of a sore arem, but is coming around well this spring; righthander with a roundhouse curve and fair fast ball.

BESTE, Don-a transfer from Yakima JC where he pitched last year; has a fast ball and quite a bit of "stuff", but lacks centrol.

CAVALINI, John--frosh righthander from Cle-Elum; chucked from the guarter back slot for the Wildcat's last fall: has the fastest ball on the squad, but he lacks control.

GEMMIL, Dick-the only returning lettering pitcher from last year: a righthander with pin-point control and good speed.

GUSTAFSON, Don-senior finally breaking in to the varsity; a conrol pitcher without too much speed; pitched for Lincoln of Tacoma in high school.

PLAYER PROFILES (con't)

MAINS, Tex-a sophomore with a good fast ball and surve, but little control; should develop into a top-notch chucker.

FIRST BASE-

NIKON, Russ-top U of Washington frosh chucker last year: a southpaw with speed. stuff and control; the Cats! first string hurler; lettered for the Central Casaba squad.

HILL, John-another sophomore; adept with the glove, but a bit weak at the plate; a sophemore with a great future.

SECOND BASE--

HASHMAN, Bill-a transfer form Olympic JC in Bremerton; has a terririd arm and is a real hustler, but not too strong with the club; will probably be the Cats' tep second sacker.

MARSHALL, Gib -- a sophomore with a year's JV experience behind him; a good field, no hit infielder; should see plenty of action, though.

THIRD BASE-CONNER, Lloyd-the "tig stick" of the Wildcat squad is seeing his last year's action, with Central's nine; very good at covering the hot corner and has a powerful arm for the long throws to first; oldest man on the squad at 27.

PLAYER PROFILES (con't) -

LUKENS, Ken-one of the three fresh on the varsity; played his high school ball at Kennewick; good fielding, and fair hitting boy.

SHORTSTOP--

KUHIMAN, Bud-a shophomore holding down the top shortstop job; good fielder with a strong accurate arm and with plenty of power at the plated; a one year letterman.

O'GR.DY, Gorky-a two year letterman, but now on the second string; weilds a mighty bat, but does nt field to well; may move back up.

case, Bill-one of Central's top, hitters last season and also a very good center field-er; a speedy, clever base runner; playing his last season with the Cats.

KATALINICH, George—a power laded frosh right fielder from Cle Elum; he hits hard when he hits, and patrols the right garden very ably.

RCGERS, Bob--a southpaw left fielder, who hits the ball hard; a senior with no previous varieity experience.

MILLER, Jim-a frosh converted form third to the cutfield; lacks experience cut there, but should be okay; hits well.

COACH

L.E. "Monte" Reynolds, Central Washington College Track Coach, has headed some very successful teams in his five years at Contral.

His squads won the St. Martin's relays two consecutive years, '48-'49, the only time in the history of the relays such a feat has been accomplished.

Monte is a graduate of the University of Montena class of 1934, While there he starred in football, basketball and track. He set a school record in the shotput while there.

After graduating, he went into high school coaching although he had a chance to sign with the Detroit Lions, pro football club. When the war came along, he went into the navy where he served for three years in the Pacific theater. After this hitch, he took over the coaching reigns of Missoula, Montana, high school for a year, before coming to Central.

When he first came to CWCE, Monte was head football ceach as well as track menter and an instructor in physical education. In 1948 he was relieved of his football worries, and now handles only the track mentor's job.

Promising newcomers include Louie Bogdonovich, a hurdling ransfer form Grays Harbor College; Nels Lundstrum and Ray Adams,
frosh sprinters from Ellensurg High School;
Bill McCormick, weights and broad jump; Dick
Hansen, a junior up form the intramural ranks;
Gordy Adams, junior Broad jumper; Bob Vance,
frosh distanceman from Ellensburg, and Bill
Jenne, a sophemore pole vaulter.

The Wildcats face a very tough slate this year, with three of their meets being triangular affairs ith Eastern and Whitworth, the powers of the conference. As an added feature, the Wildcats will be hest to the first annual Evergreen relays, to be held May 3, on Cnetral's new track in Ellensburg.
