Central's athletic facilities are now being improved as rapidly as finances permit. A new track is going into use for the first time this spring, and a new fieldhouse is to be started in the near future.

COACH

Arnold H. "Arne" Faust came to Central in 1947 as baseball coach and assistant in basketball. He is a 1939 graduate of the University of Washington, but he attended Central two years and starred in baseball and basketball.

He was an instructor at Central, before entering the navy in 1944, in the Army Air Force college training program.



Before coming to Central he ran up an enviable record in the Portland, Oregon, prep circuit. His Franklin high school teams copped the city championships in all three major sports in 1943.

Since Central started competing in baseball in 1948, Faust's teams have won two Evergreen pennants. Last year, with no official league competition, the Wildcats won only 4 while losing 10.

LUKENS, Ken--one of the three fresh on the varsity; played his high school ball at Kennewick; good fielding, and fair hitting boy.

SHORTSTOP--

KUHELMAN, Bud--a sophomore holding down the top shortstop job; good fielder with a strong accurate arm and with plenty of power at the plate; a one year letterman.

O'GRADY, Gorky--a two year letterman, but now on the second string; wields a mighty bat, but doesn't field too well; may move back up.

OUTFIELD--

CASE, Bill--one of Centrals top hitters last season and also a very good center fielder; a speedy, clever base runner; playing his last season with the Cats.

KATLINICH, George--a power laded frosh right fielder from Cle Elum; he hits hard when he hits, and patrols the right garden very ably.

ROGERS, Bob--a southpaw left fielder, who hits the ball hard; a senior with no previous varsity experience.

MILLER, Jim--a frosh converted from third to the outfield; lacks experience out there, but should be okay; hits well.

TRACK

COACH

L.E. "Monte" Reynolds, Central Washington College Track Coach, has headed some very successful teams in his five years at Central.

His squads won the St. Martin's relays two consecutive years, '48-'49, the only time in the history of the relays such a feat has been accomplished.



Monte is a graduate of the University of Montana class of 1934. While there he starred in football, basketball and track. He set a school record in the shotput while there.

After graduating, he went into high school coaching although he had a chance to sign with the Detroit Lions, pro football club. When the war came along, he went into the navy where he served for three years in the Pacific theater. After this hitch, he took over the coaching reigns of Missoula, Montana, high school for a year, before coming to Central.

When he first came to CWCE, Monte was head football coach as well as track mentor and an instructor in physical education. In 1948 he was relieved of his football worries, and now handles only the track mentor's job.

TRACK

Things don't look too bad for the Central Washington College thinclads this season. According to coach Monte Reynolds, the Wildcats should be strong in the track events but quite weak in the field entries. Lost form last year's squad were Ron Dahlin, javelin; John Richardson, high jump and hurdles; and Orland Anderson, holder of CWC pole vault record.

Back to form, the nucleus of the '52 squad are Andy Tagger, veteran high jumper and hurdler; Bob White, sophomore sprint man; Pete Thorp, junior letterman in the distance grinds; Jack Benner, one of the top javelin tossers in the conference; Chuck Wolther, letterman in the middle distances; Dave Duclaw and Jow Erickson, both lettermen with the weights; Dick Barrett and Brad Fischer in the 440; Bill Wilkinson in the distances.

Promising newcomers include Louie Bogdonovich, a hurdling transfer from Grays Harbor College; Nels Lundstrom and Ray Adams, fresh sprinters from Ellensburg High School; Bill McCormick, weights and broad jump; Dick Hansen, a junior up from the intramural ranks; Gordy Adams, junior broad jumper; Bob Vance, fresh distanceman from Ellensburg, and Bill Jenne, a sophomore pole vaulter.

The Wildcats face a very tough slate this year, with three of their meets being triangular affairs with Eastern and Whitworth, the powers of the conference. As an added feature, the Wildcats will be host to the first annual Evergreen relays, to be held May 3, on Central's new track in Ellensburg.
