CAT FACT: Prior to 1980, because of limited budgets, it was common for a team to play two games in a single day. Since 1980 CWU has only twice faced that task. On Dec. 13, 1983, the Wildcats defeated Lewis & Clark 66-50 in the afternoon, then lost to Western Oregon 63-55 in a night game. The only other doubleheader in the modern era occurred on Nov. 17, 1989, when the Wildcats defeated Trinity Western 91-54 and lost to Whitworth 68-56. Both games were played at the Whitworth Fieldhouse.

'CAT FACT: In the modern era, only two CWU players - Robin Carlson in 1989 and Rose Shaw in 1999 - have had 20 or more rebounds in a single game. Amazingly, the two 20-rebound games came exactly 10 years apart, to the day. Carlson had 22 rebounds against Lewis-Clark State on Jan. 21, 1999. Shaw had 20 rebounds against Humboldt State on Jan. 21, 1999. Two players - Sonia Swan and Kristelle Arthur -each had 19 rebounds against Seattle Unuversity in 1988 when they each had 19 rebounds against Seattle University.

'CAT FACT: Stacey Gordon became the first CWU player in the modern era (since 1980) to put back-to-back 30-point games when she scored 31 against Lewis-Clark State and 30 against Seattle Pacific on Jan. 25 and Jan. 30, 1992. Nicole Trannell equaled that feat when she scored 35 points against Simon Fraser on Feb. 10, 1996, then added 36 two nights later against Puget Sound. Those are the two top single-game totals in the modern era.
