**WR, 6-1, 195**  
**Yakima - East Valley**

**High School:** Graduated from East Valley High School in 1995. Lettered in football (3) and basketball (2). Three-time all-league wide receiver and two-time all-league free safety. Was Offensive MVP in all-state game. Played forward in basketball earning second team all-league honors.

**College:** Finished career ranked third in school history in both receptions (152) and receiving yards (2,008) and 12<sup>th</sup> in scoring (134 points). Only player in school history to have three 150-yard reception games. Caught career-high 14 passes against Western Oregon senior season. . . . Twice was named to Columbia Football Association first-team all-star squad (1998 and 1999). Was selected team's Most Inspirational Player senior season. Also served as one of four team captains senior season. . . . Redshirted 1995 season. On squad, but did not letter in 1996. Developed into one of top receivers on team sophomore season, catching 28 passes for 535 yards and team-high six touchdowns. Averaged team-best 19.1 yards per catch. Caught season-high eight passes for 73 yards against Humboldt State. Had five receptions for 169 yards and two touchdowns against Eastern Oregon. . . . Ranked third in receiving in Columbia Football Association junior year, catching 71 passes for 888 yards and 12 touchdowns. Reception total second highest single-season total in school history. Yardage total ranks fifth. Had seven catches for career-high 172 yards against Humboldt State. Also had season-high 13 catches (third highest total in school history) for 163 yards against Eastern Oregon. Caught six passes for 103 yards and scored four touchdowns, one on a fumble recovery, in overtime playoff win over Rocky Mountain. . . . Led team and ranked third in CFA in receiving senior season, catching 53 passes for 585 yards. . . . Was the go-to-guy among receivers throughout collegiate career. Great competitor and makes big plays. Good hands and runs good routes.

**Misc:** Born 11-12-76 at Yakima. Law and justice major. Wants to be a paralegal. High school activities included drama and public speaking. Has two brothers and five sisters.
