Adjustment in Salary - Dr. Charles Stastny

MOTION NO. 1027: Dr. Wahle moved, seconded by Dr. Wilson, that an adjustment in salary for Dr. Charles Stastny be from step 8.5 to step 10.0 (\$9,199 to \$9,713). The motion carried. The Board congratulated Dr. Stastny on the completion of his doctorate.

Release from Contract - Joyce Horvath, HES

MOTION NO. 1028: Dr. Wilson moved, seconded by Dr. Wahle, that Joyce Horvath be released from her contract with Central. The motion carried.

Full Salary - Mary Greene, Library

pr. Brooks explained that Miss Greene's salary had been reduced 80% at retirement age but that a replacement had not been found to assume duties so she is still carrying the full load as head cataloging librarian. Find administration therefore requested that her full salary be restored to 14,191 per 12 month year.

MOTION NO. 1029: Dr. Wahle moved, seconded by Mr. Kendall, that Miss Mary Greene, Associate Professor of Librarianship, have her full salary restored to \$14,191 per 12 month year. The motion carried.

Business Affairs

Bids - Fine and Applied Arts Complex

MOTION NO. 1030: Dr. Wahle moved, seconded by Mr. Kendall, the Gus J. Bouten Construction Company (Spokane) be awarded the general contract for the construction of the Fine and Applied Arts Complex. The base bid was \$2,100,000 minus \$90,300 in deductive alternates for a total general contract of \$2,009,700. This action is subject to the review and approval by the Division of Engineering and Architecture of the State of Washington, Department of General Administration. The motion carried.

MOTION NO. 1031: Dr. Wilson moved, seconded by Dr. Wahle, that the Johnson Mechanical Corporation (Yakima) be awarded the mechanical contract for the construction of the Fine and Applied Arts Complex. The base bid was \$284,923. This action is subject to the review and approval of the Division of Engineering and Architecture of the State of Washington, Department of General Administration. The motion carried.

MOTION NO. 1032: Mr. Kendall moved, seconded by Dr. Wilson, that Electro Mart, Inc. (Yakima) be awarded the electrical contract for the construction of the Fine and Applied Arts Complex. The base bid was \$225,332 minus \$27,692 in deductive alternates for a total of \$197,640. This action is subject to the review and approval of the Division of Engineering and Architecture of the State of Washington, Department of General Administration. The motion carried.

Proposed Auxiliary Services Budget

Mr. Hansen presented the auxiliary services budget for the 1967-69 ennium. He pointed out that this was the first time that the auxiliary vices had projected a complete biennial budget. The Board complimented Wendell Hill on the completeness of the document.

Proposed New Position: Construction Inspector

Mr. Hansen proposed that, since the institution will engage in a many construction schedule during the next several years and that these spects will need close supervision, the College engage a Construction aspector to give professional attention to the construction of capital spects.
