#### pedication of Land for Extension of Helena Street

MOTION NO. 3499: Mrs. Minor moved, seconded by Mr. Caron, that the necessary legal steps be taken to provide for dedication from Central Washington State College to the City of Ellensburg, Washington, the following described parcel of land in order to provide the south one-half (thirty feet in width) of a proposed sixty-foot right-of-way at the latitude of Helena Street, subject to reversion of said parcel of land to Central Washington State College if the parcel so dedicated is not utilized for construction of a street within ten years from date of dedication.

The North 30 feet of Block 67, STATE ADDITION TO THE CITY OF ELLENSBURG NO. 1, in the County of Kittitas, State of Washington, as per plat thereof, recorded in Book 2 of Plats, page 48, records of said County. The motion carried.

## Appointment of Director of Housing Services

MOTION NO. 3500: Dr. Brain moved, seconded by Mrs. Minor, that the appointment of James P. Hollister as Director of Housing Services, be approved, effective May 17, 1971. This is a twelve-month appointment. The motion carried.

## Tuition Bond, Series B, Resolution 71-1

MOTION NO. 3501: Dr. Brain moved, seconded by Mr. Caron, to approve Resolution 71-1: The final wording of the title of Resolution No. 71-1 is as follows:

#### RESOLUTION NO. 71-1

A RESOLUTION of the Board of Trustees of Central Washington State College authorizing the issuance and sale of General Tuition Fee and Normal School Fund Revenue Bonds, Series B. of the College in the principal sum of \$3,000,000.00 to provide a part of the funds required to remodel buildings and improve facilities and campus and obtain equipment, extend and renovate utilities, landscape and irrigate improvements to the campus, pay City of Ellensburg local improvement district assessments, construct building for buildings and grounds department, undertake a long range utility study, acquire moveable equipment for projects under State Building Authority, preplan for schematic plans for new capital projects and repay temporary loans heretofore made for previously authorized capital projects and provide funds reappropriated for previously authorized capital projects; providing for the date, form, terms and maturities of such bonds; adopting certain covenants relating to the payment of the principal thereof and the interest thereon; reserving to the College the right to issue additional bonds on a parity therewith; and repealing the Resolution relating to such bonds adopted May 15, 1969.

The motion carried.

#### Resignation -- Shuman

MOTION NO. 3502: Mr. Caron moved, seconded by Dr. Brain, to accept the resignation of Mr. Howard Shuman, Director of College Relations, effective June 30, 1971. The motion carried.
