(Article II <u>Membership</u> was amended to include all students of Central Washington State College and as amended reads: Membership of this association shall consist of enrolled students of CWSC.

Mr. Dudley asked that Article VI The Judicial Branch, Section 3. be deleted and that Article VII Elections, Section 3. be deleted and a new Section 3 be substituted to read: All candidates for elective positions to be elected must receive a majority of the votes cast by the members of this association. The board asked that this section be amended to read: All candidates for elective positions to be elected in any individual election must receive a majority of the votes cast in that election by the members of this association.)

Adoption of Student Conduct Code

MOTION NO. 3542: Mr. Frank moved, seconded by Mr. Caron, to adopt the following resolution as amended. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 71-3 REGARDING STUDENT CONDUCT CODE

- WHEREAS the Campus Judicial Board, representing the Associated Students of Central Washington State College, has approved a Student Code of Conduct for the students of Central Washington State College, and
- WHEREAS said proposed Student Code of Conduct has been approved by the Administration and recommended for adoption, and
- WHEREAS it appears that said Student Code of Conduct must be adopted and promulated in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act, RCW 34.04, if it is to be effective on or before September 1, 1971.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Central Washington State College that pursuant to Ch. 57, Sec. 21, Laws of 1971, the Board of Trustees of Central Washington State College hereby delegates to the President, or the Dean of Students authority as follows:
 - To give such notice of a hearing as may be required by law to consider the promulgation of a Student Conduct Code for Central Washington State College;
 - (2) After hearing all interested parties, to adopt a Student Conduct Code for Central Washington State College to be effective no later than September 1, 1971.

Adoption of Traffic Regulations Code

MOTION NO. 3543: Mr. Frank moved, seconded by Mr. Garcia, that the following resolution be adopted. The motion carried.

RESOLUTION NO. 71-4 REGARDING TRAFFIC REGULATIONS CODE

WHEREAS the Parking and Traffic Committee, with representation from the Associated Students, faculty and Administration of Central Washington State College, have approved a Traffic Regulations Code for Central Washington State College, and

- WHEREAS it appears that said Traffic Regulations Code must be adopted and promulgated in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act, RCW 34.04, if it is to be effective on or before September 1, 1971.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Central Washington State College that pursuant to Ch. 57, Sec. 21, Laws of 1971, the Board of Trustees of Central Washington State College hereby delegates to the President, the Dean of Students, or such person as the President may designate, authority as follows:
 - (1) To give such notice of a hearing as may be required by law to consider the promulgation of a Traffic Regulations Code for Central Washington State College;
 - (2) After hearing all interested parties, to adopt a Traffic Regulations Code for Central Washington State College to be effective no later than September 1, 1971.

Educational Opportunities Program

Dr. Rodney Converse, Director of the EOP program at Central reviewed the program. He stated that of the 128 students in the program 70% are still in College. Mr. Ware, Mr. Jones, Mrs. Jones and Mr. Arambul participated in the discussion.

The motion carried.

Mr. Joseph Panattoni's Service on the Board

Mr. Frank noted that he would like to make a matter of record the feeling of the Board for the services Mr. Panattoni has given to this institution in the past six or seven years. Mr. Frank stated he would like to ask the Chairman of the Board of Trustees to write Mr. Panattoni for the Board expressing the fact that this sentiment has been set forth formally at this meeting.
