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



Student Responsibilities



PLEASE READ BEFORE REGISTERING FOR COURSES

As a CWU student, you are responsible for following the requirements and deadlines published each term in the schedule of courses. Please keep a copy of this schedule with your school records.

Financial Obligations: Admission to or registration with the University, conferring of degrees and issuance of academic transcripts may be withheld for failure to meet financial obligations to the University. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that his/her account is kept current. Payments received from students will be applied in the following priority: 1) oldest charge; 2) tuition and course fees; 3) housing and dining charges; 4) other charges.

Registration, by telephone or in-person, obligates a student for payment of all tuition and course fees. If tuition is not paid by the due date, students will be assessed a late fee and be liable for any other reasonable collection costs. Students may check with the cashier's office (963-2224) to obtain the exact amount of tuition and fees due.

Your address is very important! Please keep it updated! Addresses can be changed at your registration office. Important materials are mailed periodically to all students throughout the quarter.

Schedule Confirmation: A student may call REGI and enter a 5 and a # sign to obtain a listing of their courses. Check your schedule carefully for discrepancies. You are responsible for ensuring that the courses you select will fulfill degree requirements. Registering for courses without the necessary corequisites or prerequisites can result in being disenrolled.

Drop by Instructor: If a student fails to attend a class, the instructor may drop the student from the class roll. Students should not assume they will automatically be dropped from a class they do not attend. Check with your registration office prior to the end of the change of schedule period. Non-attendance does not relieve you of your academic and financial responsibilities.

As a student, I understand the information included in the schedule of courses is important. I will be held academically and financially responsible for the course selections I make, and *it is my responsibility to obtain academic advising for my program*.



Admission and Readmission For Undergraduates and Non-Master's Students

Students may enroll for summer session courses under a variety of different conditions. Below are the various categories for enrollment and procedures for applying. If you are in doubt as to your category or have other questions about admission or readmission, contact the Office of Admissions (509) 963-3001.

CATEGORY 1. The following types of students should fill out the Summer Information Form in this schedule and submit it to the Office of the Registrar prior to telephone registration. Include \$46 registration fee.

Continuing Students: undergraduates and graduate students who were enrolled as matriculated students during the past year (summer, fall, winter, spring) and have attended no other institution.

Nonmatriculants: students not working toward a degree or certification of any kind from CWU. Classes may be taken for personal enrichment or for transfer to another institution.

High School Students: Top high school students who wish to enroll during summer session may do so with the written approval of both the high school principal and the CWU Office of Admissions.

Obtain a High School Enrichment Form from the Office of Admissions, have it signed by your high school principal and attach your transcript. Bring the form, with the transcript attached, to the Office of Admissions for approval. After admission, submit the Summer Information Form in this schedule to the Office of the Registrar.

CATEGORY 2. The following types of students should submit a Uniform Application for Admission Form and a \$35 application fee to the Office of Admissions. Application and transcripts of all work not already on file at CWU must be received by June 15, 1997. After admission, submit Summer Information Form in this schedule and \$46 registration fee to the Office of the Registrar.

Students who receive financial aid must apply and be admitted.

Returning Undergraduate or Graduate Students: former CWU students who have not completed their course of study and were not enrolled during the past year (summer, fall, winter, spring), but who wish to return for summer session 1997.

New Undergraduate Students: new freshmen or

transfer students never before enrolled at CWU who plan to work on a degree or certification through CWU.

New Post-Baccalaureate Students: students who have completed a bachelor's degree but are not pursuing a master's degree program. Students may be working toward initial or continuing certification for vocational or professional education through CWU. Post baccalaureate students who want to pursue certification are considered as new post-baccalaureate students.

International Students: students who are in the United States on a nonimmigrant visa. (This does not include permanent residents, refugees, or Canadian students.)

Contact the office of admissions for instructions on admission procedures. Early application is encouraged. After admission, submit the Summer Information Form in this schedule to the Office of the Registrar.

Canadian Students: Follow procedure for the Uniform Application for Admission Form.

You are reminded to request an I-20 from the office of admissions. Please do this early enough to avoid problems with your border crossing. After admission, submit the Summer Information Form in this schedule to the Office of the Registrar.

Application and Admission for Master's Degree Students

New Master's Degree Students: students who have completed a bachelor's degree, either at CWU or another institution, and who will begin the master's degree program for the first time at CWU. (This includes students who have attended CWU as undergraduate students.)

Each prospective graduate student must submit an application for admission to the University. Admission to the University does not constitute admission to a master's degree program. Graduate students may apply for admission to a master's degree program, continuing certificate program or non-degree study (professional improvement, scholarly development).

A graduate student is expected to have a bachelor's degree from a college or university accredited by recognized accrediting associations prior to registering for courses. Students with a baccalaureate degree from an institution holding candidacy status

for accreditation are considered only after a review of the Analysis Report and Evaluation Committee Report of the accrediting association, which must be provided by the institution before admission will be determined.

The application to graduate study can be obtained from the Office of Admissions (Mitchell, 1st floor, 963-3001). The application, \$35 application fee, GRE scores, transcripts, three letters of recommendation, and a statement of educational objectives and professional aims must be **submitted by April 1** for admission to a master's degree program for summer quarter. Applicants to master's degree study are admitted by formal letter from the Dean of Graduate Studies.

Submit the Summer Information Form in this schedule and \$46 registration fee to the Office of the Registrar.

A master's degree program involves a close graduate faculty/student relationship in order to plan a program of study most appropriate to the professional goals and purposes of each individual applicant admitted. **Consequently, no more than nine quarter credits completed before formal admission are accepted on the official course of study for the master's degree.** This does not preclude the student from taking prerequisite or other background courses prior to admission that do not count toward the degree.

Graduate students or prospective graduate students may petition the Dean of Graduate Studies to modify graduate school regulations applying to their admission or program. A complete description of graduate school policies may be found in the CWU General Catalog.

Teacher Certification

A teacher in the state of Washington is required to convert a provisional or initial teaching certificate to a continuing teaching certificate. Candidates for the continuing certificate must meet the following requirements:

- Have a minimum of two (2) endorsements on their teaching certificate*
- Verify at least one year of full-time teaching experience
- Complete 45 credits of upper-division (300 level or higher) coursework, including courses in abuse, staff development and supervision, research and evaluation, and referral agencies.

Application forms and further information can be

obtained from the Office of the Associate Dean, located in the Public Safety Building.

In order to qualify for endorsement to teach in more than one specialization, students must meet the requirements for each specialization.

To maintain the continuing (professional) certificate, each person must complete one-hundred fifty (150) clock hours of approved in-service education and/or fifteen (15) college or university credits every five years.

*Candidates for the continuing certificate must have been granted at least two subject area endorsements. Subject area endorsements, with the exception of broad subject area endorsements of English/language arts, science and social studies, require satisfactory completion of 24 credits in specified areas of studies. Broad subject endorsements require 45 credits.

Tuition and Fees

A \$46 registration fee will be assessed for all students. The fee is in addition to tuition. The mandatory \$46 registration fee must be paid prior to preregistration. The fee can be paid in person at the CWU cashiers' office or it can be submitted with the Summer Information Form to the Office of the Registrar.

For those registering on or before June 23, 1997, full tuition and fees are due on or before June 23. For those registering after June 23, tuition and fees are due at the time of registration.

When a student registers for classes a financial obligation to the University is incurred and adjustments will be made according to the current refund policy.

VISA or MASTERCARD billing is accepted for all tuition and fee expenses for summer quarter. See the Summer Information Form in this schedule for the correct data entry.

Students who have not paid full tuition and fees by the published deadlines may be dropped from all courses and be liable for 50 percent of tuition and fees.

Because summer session is self-support, there is no non-resident fee structure. Also, there are no special waivers granted to SE Asia veterans or others in special tuition waiver programs.

Listed tuition and fees are subject to modification by the state or by Central's Board of Trustees.

Students who are registered for 5 or more credits on the Ellensburg campus must pay a mandatory \$20.00 Health and Counseling fee.

Refunds

A continuing student will receive 100 percent of tuition and fees only if complete university withdrawal occurs prior to the published deadline.

There is **no refund for individual course withdrawals** after the change of schedule period.

There is no refund of tuition and fees if withdrawal from the University occurs after the published deadlines.

\$46 registration fee: Students who cancel their registration through the Office of the Registrar before June 6, 1997, may request a refund of the \$46 fee. **Any cancellation after June 6, 1997,** results in forfeiture of the \$46 registration fee.

POLICY FOR WITHDRAWAL FROM CLASS

Because of short terms in summer, withdrawal dates are different than other quarters. Check the summer session calendar for withdrawal dates. No refunds are granted for individual course withdrawals.

REGI, Central's VOICE RESPONSE TELEPHONE

REGISTRATION SYSTEM is available for preregistration for summer 1997. The following pages and worksheet will explain the process in detail. It is easy if you use a true touchtone telephone, and remember to end each transaction with a pound sign. Be sure to register early – all courses are on a first-come firstserved basis. Unless 10 graduate or 15 undergraduate students are enrolled, a course may be cancelled. If a course is cancelled, you may transfer to another open class with equal credit or request a tuition refund.

Preregistration by Telephone Only

Preregistration is only available by telephone May 12 through June 6. The Summer Information Form along with a \$46 registration fee is required in advance of registration. Please submit to CWU Registrar's Office, Ellensburg, WA 98926-7465. Allow time for processing before calling "REGI."

Registration Fee

All students will be assessed a \$46 registration fee. Students who cancel their preregistration before June 6, 1997, may request a full \$46 refund. Any cancellation after June 6, 1997, results in forfeiture of the \$46 registration fee.

Basic REGI Information

- 1. **CALL NUMBER**: This is a five digit number listed in front of each course section in the schedule book. This is the number you use with REGI for adding or dropping courses.
- 2. ACTION CODE: An action code is a series of numbers that identifies the term and academic year for which you are registering. See REGI worksheet.
- 3. **PIN NUMBER**: This is your personal identification number. See REGI worksheet.
- 4. PERMISSION ENTRY CODE: Entry codes are five-digit numbers issued to you by departments to enroll in restricted course sections. Courses requiring entry codes are designated with the symbol > to the left of the course in the schedule book. Departments reserve the right to require entry codes whether or not the course is designated as such in the schedule. Once you use an entry code, REGI will not accept it again. REGI will prompt you for the permission entry code.
- 5. ALTERNATE SECTIONS: If the section requested is closed you will be informed by REGI of open alternate sections if available. Have a pencil ready and be prepared to write down the call number of the course. You can list your courses to determine location of the course.
- 6, **TIME CONFLICT**: You may not register on REGI for two courses that meet at the same time. You must add the second course in person at your registration office during open registration. Students should consult with the instructors of the conflicting courses before registering.

- 7. **CREDIT/NO CREDIT, REPEAT, AUDIT**: You may register for the course on REGI but you must go in person to your registration office to report the option by the end of the change of schedule period. AUDIT requires faculty permission prior to adding the option.
- 8. **OVERLOADS**: Additional credits require departmental approval. See policy under general regulations in schedule. Overloads may be added during the **change of schedule period** at your registration office.
- 9. WAIT LIST: When adding a class, if the course is full and has a **wait-list available, REGI will advise you**. At this point, enter 95# if you wish to be wait-listed. REGI will also notify you if additional sections of the same course are available at another time. TO OFFICIALLY REGISTER, OBTAIN DEPARTMENTAL PERMISSION. ADMISSION TO A WAIT LISTED COURSE IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE INSTRUCTOR.
- 10. **INDIVIDUAL STUDY COURSES:** Submit an orange individual study form to the department secretary for approval. Leave the form with the department. On REGI enter the individual study course call number listed in the schedule book. REGI will notify you that the course has a variable credit option and give you the minimum and maximum numbers of credits you can enter. Please be sure to input the number of credits that you have received department permission to enter.
- 11. **LIST YOUR SCHEDULE:** On REGI, DIAL 5#. REGI will list your class schedule along with the call number, meeting time, and location of the course. Please write this information down and verify for accuracy and correct number of credits.
- 12. **DISCONNECT ACTION**: To **exit**, enter 9# and listen to important messages. Time limits are built into the system. If you are holding on the REGI line for an extended period of time you will be disconnected.

HINTS: Add Drop Erase Wait List	 To add a class enter 2* call number #. Don't forget the "*" or "#". "REGI" will tell you what course you registered for and at what time. To drop a class enter 3* call number # To erase a mistake during entry enter *# To wait list a class (if available for wait list) enter 95#
Step Five:	• To hear a list of your scheduled courses enter 5#. This may be done anytime during preregistration and open registration after you have registered.
Step Six:	• To exit enter 9# and listen for important messages.
	You need to take care of all university holds prior to registration. "REGI" will not permit you to register if you have a hold, (i.e. library fines, parking fines, etc.)
Disconnect Action	• Time limits are built into the system, so if you are holding on the "REGI" line for an extended period of time, you will be disconnected.
Alternate Selections	• If the section requested is closed, you will be informed by "REGI" of open section alternates (including new sections added after the publication of the summer session schedule). You can then immediately select an alternate section to be added to your schedule. Have a pencil ready and be prepared to write down the call number and section number of the course.

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General Information

Numbering of Courses

Courses are numbered as follows:

Graduate	500	through	700

Students may elect courses one year ahead of their present status except when otherwise designated. Courses numbered 500 and above are normally for graduate students. Senior students may take 500 level courses only with the approval of both the department chairperson and the instructor of the class. The 500 level may be used for undergraduate credit or graduate credit (but not both). In order to receive graduate credit, the student must be in his/her senior year of undergraduate work and must obtain approval from the Dean of Graduate Studies.

Graduate (Post-Baccalaureate & Master's)

- 16 credits or less No permission required
- 17-19 credits Major Department Chair or Dean approval required
- 20 or more credits Graduate Dean's approval required

Audit

A student eligible to enroll in a course for credit may enroll as an auditor except in laboratory courses, provided that space is available and permission is secured from the instructor prior to registration. Full tuition is assessed for audits, and no credit is earned.

Instructors may not compel auditors to write papers or take examinations, but may insist upon other course requirements. The instructor may request of the dean that the auditor be officially withdrawn from the course if these requirements are not met. Audited courses require written permission from the department.

Repetition of Courses

Some courses are approved for repetition with credit awarded each time the course is taken and passed. Such approval is indicated in the course description. Other courses may be repeated: (1) Credit will be awarded only once; (2) When a course is repeated, only the last grade earned will be used in the computation of the cumulative grade point average. However, all grades will remain in the student's official record; (3) Major grade point averages will also be computed on the basis of the last grade earned when major courses are repeated.

Incomplete Policy

An "I" (incomplete) means the student was not able to complete the course by the end of the term, but has satisfactorily completed a sufficient portion of it and can be expected to finish without having to reenroll in it. An "I" is not used in computing a grade point average.

Unless the incomplete is removed and a grade submitted by the instructor within the space of one calendar year, the "1" will convert to an F.

Credit/No Credit Option

All students except first quarter freshmen and students on academic probation may select one course per quarter under the credit/no credit option. Students are urged to use this option as a way to explore academic areas of interest. A maximum of 15 credits earned in credit/no credit courses may be allowed toward the 180 required for the bachelor's degree.

The courses must be selected from breadth requirements and free electives; they must not be courses in the basic, major, or minor concentrations or the professional education sequence.

Students designate the course as credit/no credit during registration or during "change of schedule" period. Courses for which a grade has been recorded may not be repeated on a credit/no credit option.

Credits earned under the credit/no credit option are not included in computing the grade point average. The grade recorded on the student's transcript will be "CR" if the course grade is C- or above; if below C-, the entry will be "NC".

Procedure for Enrolling in Individual Study Forms are available in the Office of the Registrar, Center Offices and the departmental offices. Permission must be granted from the instructor and department chairperson. Complete the form, including the 18–space descriptive title and course outline on back of the card. Submit the approved form to the department secretary. Complete registration following procedures on page 10.

Procedure for Enrolling in Cooperative Education (Contracted Field Experience)

Cooperative Education Learning Agreement Forms are available at the departmental offices or the Cooperative Education Center. Students must plan adequate time to complete the form and obtain the required signatures. All signatures are required before registration can be completed. The Learning Agreement must be submitted to the Cooperative Education Center at least a week before summer session begins. Registration is done by the Co-op Center staff. A copy of the Learning Agreement is returned to the student by mail. Please contact the Cooperative Education Center, (509) 963-2404, for forms or more information.

Academic Advising

Students should make arrangements for academic advising through the academic department that offers their intended major. For the names of departmental coordinators of advising, students may contact the departments or Academic Advising Center (509) 963-3001 in SUB 211.

Students in the continuing certificate program (fifth year) should direct questions to the certification office in the Public Safety Building, (509) 963-2661.

Graduation

Application for baccalaureate degree graduation may be made at the Office of the Registrar during the quarter preceding the quarter in which the degree is to be received or not later than June 13, 1997, for summer.

Students must assume the responsibility for meeting all degree requirements and total credits for graduation.

Financial Aid

Students who want financial aid for summer quarter 1997 need to submit the 1996-97 Free Application for Federal Student Aid before May 1 if they have not already done so. No late applications will be processed.

Technology Fee

All students enrolled in courses requiring a computer lab will be charged a \$25 technology fee. All freshmen with 10 or more credits will be charged the \$25 fee or \$2.50 per credit for less than 10 credits.

Concurrent Enrollment

Students enrolled at CWU who are also enrolled at another institution during the same quarter must complete a Concurrent Enrollment Form. All student load policies will apply.

Procedure for Course Substitution and Waiver of Course Requirements:

Major or Minor: The student is required to provide the Office of the Registrar with the substitution form to waive the requirement, signed by the appropriate chairperson and dean. Substitution forms are available at your registration office.

Professional Education Sequence: The student is required to provide the Office of the Registrar with the substitution form to waive the requirement, signed by the Curriculum and Supervision Department Chairperson and Dean. Substitution forms are available at your registration office.

Basic, Breadth, or other Graduation Requirements: The Dean of Academic Services handles most deviations from the catalog requirements. The petition forms are available at your registration office.


Residence Hall Accommodations For Summer Session Students

Residence hall accommodations are available this summer for those students living on campus for a minimum of one term (4 ½ weeks). The halls to be utilized were not designated at press time. Residence hall accommodations consist of the room and board combination, offering a choice of single or double occupancy. Rooms in the residence halls are furnished, however, each student may choose to bring accessories needed while living in the hall. Linens must be provided by the student, as the University does not provide bedding, towels, etc.

Those students who require accommodations for less than one term are housed in the Conference Center.

Apartments

The Student Village complex offers apartments to juniors, seniors, graduate students and married students without children. Apartment sizes vary to include studio, one- two- and three-bedroom apartments. All apartments are fully furnished.

Special Course Offerings

Administrative Office Management

ADMG 398. Personal Finance via Internet (3) June 23 - August 22

The study of personal finance resources available on the Internet. Students will be able to complete course without coming to campus provided they are connected to the Internet. Contact CWU Business Education Home Page (www.cwu.edu/~ambe) for registration details.

Art

ART 498. Pinhole Photography (2) June 23 - July 11

Students will explore the basic principles of photography using pinhole cameras. Class participants will construct three pinhole cameras from cardboard that represent wide-angle, telephoto and normal lenses. The final imagery may be presented using historical cyanotype and Vandyke brown printing methods.Fee.

ART 498. Photo and Electronic Imaging (3) July 24 - August 22

The focus of this course is the transfer of traditional darkroom studio photography to computerize digital imaging. Class participants will learn basic digital imaging skills including scanning, photo editing and printing processes. The emphasis will be on transforming the student's own photographic images into digital art form. Fee.

Business Education

BSED/ME 401. Principles & Philosophy of Vocational Education (3)

June 23 - July 3

BSED/EDCS 498. Internet for Educators (1) June 30 - July 2

Use of the Internet and its tools–electronic mail, World Wide Web, file transfer, and Telnet.

Also taught at Skagit Valley Community College and SeaTac Center.

BSED 491. Basic Network Management (2) July 7 - 11

Prerequisite: knowledge of computer applications. Develop and improve network administration and management skills. Ways to load software, add and modify user accounts, back up server, and perform other management tasks.

BSED 498. Windows 95 (2) July 23 - 26

Comprehensive overview of the most common features of Microsoft Windows 95 for managing files, printing, sharing data, personalizing the desktop.

BSED 491. Powerpoint Presentations (1) July 28 - 30

Provide skill in using Powerpoint as an instructional tool.

BSED 498. Microsoft Office Applications (2) August 11 - 15

Microsoft Office suite of applications, including Office Manager, Word, Excel, Powerpoint, and integrating applications.

Also taught at Skagit Valley Community College and SeaTac Center.

BSED 591. Changes in Office Technology (2) August 4 - 8

Changes in the administrative office due to technological innovations-position requirements, equipment, procedures, layout, and personnel practices. Visitations to leading-edge business offices in the Seattle area. *Taught at the SeaTac Center.*

Communication

COM 315a. Communication Studies: Communication and Conflict (1)

July 11 - 13

Here's a chance to gain academic and practical knowledge of the communication skills involved in dealing with, and managing, conflict. Given this easy-tohandle one-weekend format, anyone who deals with conflict (teachers, business people, public servants or other humans) can gain empowering training and experience. Students must be prepared to participate. This class starts at 3:00 p.m. on Friday afternoon and ends Sunday at 12:00 noon.

COM 315d. Communication Studies: Managing Speech Fright (1)

July 18 - July 20

This three-day workshop is only for those who want to be more effective at speaking before a group. Through a series of presentations and exercises, we intend to empower business people, teachers, public servants and students to manage their anziety about speaking, and turn the anxiety into energy for enhanced performance. Students will find that this training enhances their success in every class requiring oral presentations of any sort.

COM 498. Video Production for Teachers (3) July 9 - 23

Many high schools offer students an opportunity to use camcorders to shoot video yearbooks and special events. Some schools have television studios to produce broadcast news programs.

Yet, many teachers are assigned these projects or courses with limited training in the skills required to teach students to effectively communicate in the broadcast medium.

This course will acquaint teachers with camera equipment techniques and broadcast writing style to create programming which effectively employs the television medium.

English

ENG 235. Studies in Folklore (4) June 30 - August 8

This class will study ballads and blues - read them, listen to them and learn something about the worlds they come from and reflect. Our material consists of British ballads, their American versions, American ballads, and a sampling of traditional, country blues. We will take the point of view that this is "aural poetry" - composed by ear and intended for the ear. No background in literature is required. There will be quizzes and three tests.

ENG 329. World Literature II (4) June 30 - August 8

This class is the second in the World Literature survey (best taken in sequence). It concentrates on major works of literature written in languages other than English from the 18th century into the 20th century. Most of the works are European. We will read such authors as Moliere, Flaubert, Akhmatova, Bachman. Some literary background is expected. There will be quizzes, two papers and two tests. The class is intended for English majors, but should be of interest to students who wish to broaden their cultural backgrounds.

ENG 410/514. Studies in Major British Writers/Advanced Studies in English Literature: Modern British Drama (4) June 30 - August 8

Six plays, three each by George Bernard Shaw and Sean O'Casey, the two pre-eminent playwrights on the British/Irish scene at the turn of the last century and in the early decades of this century. The class shall read and discuss the plays and playwrights in class, then research and write papers on individual plays to be read in class-conferences.

ENG 411/515. Studies in Major American Writers (4) The Contemporary Essay

June 30 - August 8

Though less familiar than the lyric poem and the short story, the essay, at the moment, is undergoing what many readers consider a renaissance. This course introduces the student to essays in two ways: by reading them, and by writing them.

ENG 411/515. Studies in Major American Writers (4) Hurston

June 30 - August 8

This course will examine most of the works of Zora Neale Hurston, an American writer often associated with the literary/artistic movement known as the Harlem Renaissance. We will read not only Hurston's novels, such as Jonah's Gourd Vine and Their Eyes Were Watching God, but also some of her prose, such and Mules and Men (her study of Voodoo in New Orleans), and her controversial autobiography, Dust Tracks on a Road. In addition, we will look at a number of her short stories and articles. This course will be an intensive "Major Literary Figures" course, but it may also be used as an elective. Class requirements for the undergraduate and graduate-level courses will be somewhat different.

ENG 498/598. Washington Writer's Workshop (4) Fiction Writing July 28 - August 8

Emphasis on various techniques for getting started, for revising, and for bringing work to completion. Focuses on the elements of character and point of view, and involves looking closely at student manuscripts.

ENG 498/598. Washington Writer's Workshop (4) Non-Fiction Writing July 28 - August 8

Considers different types of creative nonfiction, such as the memoir and the journal, but focuses primarily on the personal essay. Emphasizes close examination of the participants' manuscripts.

ENG 498/598. Washington Writer's Workshop (4) Poetry Writing

July 28 - August 8

For advanced to graduate level poets. Explores all aspects of technique, with close examination of the work of all participants and extensive discussion of form and theory as it is expressed in contemporary poetry.

ENG 598. Central Washington Writing Project (12) June 23 - July 25

Development and implementation of successful strategies for teaching writing, writing in all the disciplines, portfolio assessment, whole language in K college, integration of computers in the writing/language arts curriculum, implementation of in-service workshops for school districts. Participants prepare as inservice leaders. Twelve hours of credit may be applied to the M.A. in English (teaching option) or to the M.A. in Education (master teacher). All participants receive a scholarship from the National Writing Project. For K college teachers in all subject areas. By permission of instructor only. Application deadline: April 18. Contact English department at 963-1546, Dr. Bobby Cummings at 963-1075, or WWWeb at http://www.cwu.edu/~cwwp/ for application materials.

Geology

GEOL 145, 145.1. Physical Geology (4,1) June 30 - August 8

An introductory course emphasizing the origin and nature of the common rocks, and the continually changing features of the earth's crust. Application of map study to geological processes and land forms, identification of rocks and minerals. Four lectures, two hours lab per week. GEOL 145 and 145.1 must be taken concurrently. May require field trips.

GEOL 350. Northwest Geology (3) June 30 - August 8

Prerequisites, GEOL 145 and 145.1 or permission. The physical and historical geology of the Pacific Northwest. The Pacific Northwest has a recorded history exemplifying over one billion years of geologic activity. We will examine local and regional features such as the majestic volcanic mountains of the Cascades and the effects of the last ice age, slides, maps, rock samples, and video presentations will add to the class discussions. Short field trips to illustrative localities are planned.

History

The Department of History will be offering a mixed program during the summer of 1997. **History 102, 103**, and **144** will help to satisfy a student's general education requirements and also count towards completion of the history major. **History 301** is a requirement for completion of the history education major and counts as an upper-division elective. Students wishing to satisfy the African, United States or Asian course content requirements for the history major may take **History 331**, **452**, or **482**; graduate students in history can also use **History 552** or **582** to satisfy the requirements for the master's degree. The department welcomes students who wish to take upper-division courses as general electives.

Industrial and Engineering Technology

IET 398. Energy Systems (4)

July 24 - August 22

Comprehensive overview of energy technology including societal issues, energy reserves, fossil, nuclear, solar, wind, geothermal and biomass power generation, cogeneration and hydrogen economy. Lab demonstration.

IET 401. Principles and Philosophy of Vocational Education (3)

June 23 - July 3

Overview of Principles, Philosophy, Foundations and History. Will provide students with an understanding of the terminology, governmental structure, history and programs associated with public school vocational education in the United States.

IET 498. Building Technology Education (3) June 23 - July 3

This course is designed to provide practicing teachers with the opportunity to write curriculum and develop teaching aids and laboratory experiments in the area of Technology Education.

MET 320. Fundamentals of Laser Technology (4) June 23 - July 23

Overview of laser technology with emphasis on laset characteristics, safety and applications.

Marketing

ME 331. Teaching Marketing Education (3) July 22-August 9

ME 445. Techniques of Cooperative Education (3) July 22-August 9



Music

MUS 102. Introduction to Music (5)

June 23 - July 23 or July 24 - August 22 Fundamental musical concepts (melody, harmony, rhythm, form, etc.) through illustrations of the instrumental and vocal music of major composers from the earliest period through the present day.

MUS 230. Diction for Singing Foreign Languages (3) June 23 - July 23

Covers Italian, French, and German pronunciation for the voice student.

MUS 326. Music in the Classroom (3) June 23 - July 23

Techniques used in helping children to develop musically through singing, rhythmic activities, creative activities, listening, and playing instruments.

For the general classroom teacher. Enrollment is subject to admission in the Teacher Education Program.

MUS 355. Jazz Improvisation (3) June 23 - July 23

Overview of Jazz history as it has impacted the evolution of instrumental jazz styles. Class activities include transcription and performance of recorded improvisations in an imitative style.

MUS 379/598. Philosophy of Music (3) June 23 - July 23

Great music as a source of insights into human beings and the world.

MUS 380. Music History Review (3) June 23 - July 23

A review of the material presented in the required undergraduate music history sequence. Specifically intended for graduate students. The final exam will be equivalent to the graduate music history diagnostic examination. May not be used to satisfy upper-division undergraduate or graduate degree requirements.

MUS 498/598. History/Symphonic Band Literature (3) June 23 - July 7

This course will be a review and analysis of wind literature dating from 1600 to the present.

MUS 498/598. The Children's Choir; Literature (3) July 8 - July 22

This course will explore issues related to the children's choir including the child's voice and choral rehearsal techniques. This course is designed for those who are or will be working in the choral field with children. This includes those employed by schools and churches.

MUS 499/599. Musical Direction for Broadway Musicals (3) June 23 - July 7

Techniques and methods of musical direction of Broadway Musicals for the secondary school teacher. Choosing a work, preparing rehearsals, making a schedule, working with singers.

MUS 520. Methods of Teaching Theory (3) June 23 - July 23

MUS 521. Methods of Musical Research (3) June 23 - July 23

MUS 541. Advanced Conducting/Instrumental (3) July 8 - 22

Emphasis upon the conducting of advanced literature in the major performance media.

MUS 554D. Advanced Techniques/Woodwinds (1) June 23 - July 23

For advanced study on secondary instrument/woodwind.

MUS 554E. Advanced Techniques/Brass (1)

June 23 - July 23

Advanced study on secondary instrument/brass.

Physics

PHYS 101. Astronomy (5) June 23 - August 22

Experience the awesome wonder of the universe in this introduction to the variety of celestial objects and the phenomena associated with them. The course will also emphasize how we know and can continue to learn about the universe. The class will meet for six hours per week for lectures, labs, and evening sessions.

PHYS 111. Introductory Physics (5) June 30 - August 8

Prerequisites, high school algebra and high school trigonometry. This course provides a basic understanding of physical phenomena relating to position, rate of change of position, rate of change in velosity (acceleration), force, mass, Newton's law of motion, momentum, work and energy. Some interesting physical phenomena will be analyzed in words, disgrams, graphs and simple algebra. This course and lab together may be applied toward the CWU general education breadth requirement for natural science.

Safety Education

SED 382. Driver Task Analysis (3) June 30 - August 1

Prerequisite: SED 180 or concurrent enrollment. Introduction to traffic safety education, the highway transportation system, driver task analysis, classroom instructional techniques.








## **CWU Drug and Alcohol Policy**

#### I POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

The University's policy regarding the possession and consumption of alcohol and other drugs on campus has been developed in keeping with Washington state law (see RCW and WAC) and the Governor's policy on alcoholism and drug dependency. Members of the University community may review these current policies at the University library. The University Policy assumes that individuals or one can by Washington state laws. A. Some of the laws you may wish to be familiar with are: RCW 66.44.270 Furnishing Liquor to Minors-Possession and Use. PCW 66.24.481 - Public Places and Clubs Dublic Places assumes that individuals of the University community have read, understood, and agree to abide

- Opening or Consuming Liquor in Public Place Penalty Buying Liquor Illegally
- RCW 66.44.150

RCW 66.44.291 - Minors Purchasing Liquor WAC 296-24-073 - Safe Place Standards Article IV offenses and penalties, RCW 695.0.401 thru 69.50.412, described various penalties or Arite iv orienses and penantes, few 05:0,401 thr 05:0,412, described various penantes or sanction that may occur if one is illegally involved with controlled substances. If convicted, sanctions range from 90 days in jail and a \$1,000 fine, a misdemeanor, to a class B felony, ranging from 10 years in jail to a \$20,000 fine. The sanctions in Washington State vary sometimes depending on amount of substance and whether it is your first or second offense. Sanctions related to alcohol or other drug offenses in Washington state range from community hours (possibly including a fine) up to a class B felony charge. Further information is available at the

- WAC 10-120-027 Proscribed Conduct. A student shall be subject to disciplinary action or sanction upon violation of any of the following conduct proscriptions:
  (14) Possession, use, or distribution on campus of any controlled substance as defined by the laws of the United States or the state of Washington except as expressly permitted by law.
  (15) Violation of the university policy on alcoholic beverages which states:
  (a) Persons twenty-one years of age or older may possess and/or consume alcoholic beverages within the privacy of their residence hall rooms or apartments. Washington State law provides severe penalties for the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages by persons under twenty-one years of age and for persons who furnish abcholic hourset to the survey of these law and alcoholic beverages to minors. All University students should be aware of these laws and the possible consequences of violations.
  - (b) The University does not condone the consumption of alcoholic beverages by minors at In conversity does not controlle the consumption of alcoholic beverages by minors at functions sponsored by Central Washington University organizations. Organizations are held responsible for the conduct of their members at functions sponsored by the organization and for failure to comply with the Washington State law. The Campus Judicial Council may place on probation any organization or prohibit a specific campus social function when the consumption of alcoholic beverages has become terrebuter to be University or consumption of alcoholic beverages has become

function. If they choose to do so, they are urged to consider the effects and the responsibility they assume in making such decisions. If the members of the club or organization choose to involve themselves with alcoholic beverages, they must comply with the specified liquor guidelines

All groups and organizations sponsoring social events held on the CWU campus and all recognized University groups holding events off campus which involve the serving and consumption of alcoholic beverages are obliged to comply with the following procedures and guidelines:

- 1. All events will be staffed by one or more certified Social Attendant(s) who has completed the
- All events will be staffed by one or more certified Social Attendant(s) who has completed the required training course provided by the Washington State Liquor Control Board. The number of Social Attendants for a given event will be determined and subsequently hired through the University Substance Abuse Prevention Program.
   If alcoholic beverages are to be served at a social event, the sponsoring University group is required to provide nonalcoholic beverages as well. The variety of alcoholic and nonalcoholic beverages available to be served shall be equal. In addition, the sponsoring group is encouraged to also provide food at the social event, in keeping with the intent of a banquet permit, Provision for serving such nonalcoholic beverages must be outlined on the University permit
- Personal identification will be checked to verify age and to prevent minors from consuming 3. alcoholic beverages; identification will include a picture of the individual. Individuals whose age cannot be verified by identification provided to the Social Attendant will not be served beverages containing alcohol. Acceptance or rejection of identification is within the discretion 4. If it is determined by the Social Attendant that an individual has consumed too much alcohol,
- she/he will no longer be served beverages containing alcohol. If an individual becomes verbally and/or physically abusive, the Social Attendant will do any or all of the following: 5.
  - Inform the coordinator of the event of the problem behavior;
  - Call the Student Union Building Night Manager;

Call Campus Security.

- After the event, a written report will be completed by the Social Attendant which will describe any problems, concerns, or suggestions that pertain to the event. The report will be kept on 6. any problems, concerns, or suggestions that pertain to the event. The report will be kept on file and reviewed if and when the sponsoring organization subsequently requests University space for social functions involving alcohol consumption. Documentation of problems or violations at previous social events may result in the group not being allowed an alcohol use permit in the future. In addition, any areas of concern will be provided, in writing, to the sponsoring organization after the event. A copy of this and any subsequent communication will be kept on file in the University Substance Abuse Prevention Program Office. Sponsoring organizations should be aware of the consequences of failure to comply with the policy regarding the serving and consumption of alcoholic beverages. The individuals responsible for the event will be held accountable under all Washington state iaws. Other possible consequences include, but are not limited to:
- 7. a. Sponsoring clubs and organizations may lose recognition as official university clubs and
  - organizations.
- organizations. b. Visiting groups may not be allowed to use University facilities in the future. c. Other University groups may not be issued alcohol use permits in the future III. ADVERTISEMENT

III. ADVENTISEMENT There will be no marketing or advertising of alcoholic beverages on the Central Washington University campus, except as allowed by State law. The University name will not be associated with the advertising of alcoholic beverages. IV. STUDENT ASSISTANCE AND INTERVENTION PROGRAMS

#### GENERAL STUDENT ASSISTANCE

In order to promote the health and well-being of our student population, the University employs a Student Assistance Program (SAP) when dealing with student alcohol and other drug abuse problems. Any student may take advantage of the SAP through self-referral or referral by other students, staff, or faculty.

The Student Assistance Program can assess the seriousness of a substance abuse problem, identify healthy alternatives for dealing with a problem, and make referrals to the appropriate services and/or treatment programs. The SAP also helps in the development of needed interventions with students, staff, and faculty. The SAP also coordinates case management/followvices for those in recovery and/or recently completing substance abuse treatment.

#### BEHAVIORAL PROBLEMS

When student behavioral problems associated with alcohol and other drug abuse occur, the University employs a team problem-solving approach. The Director of Housing, Director of Residence Living, and the Chief of Campus Police join the Assistant and Associate Vice Presidents Residence Living, and the Uniet of Campus Police join the Assistant and Associate vice residents for Student Alfairs weekly to review Residence Living Incident Reports filed by Living Group Advisors (LGA's) and Managers, as well as Campus Police Reports which cover both on- and off-campus students. This problem-solving team then deals with student behavioral problem-generally violative of the conduct proscriptions contained with the CWU Student Judicial Code (WAC 10612()). It has been found that alcohol and other drug abuse is involved in the majority of tradematic drugs and the conduct problem solving to any active to every the conduct problem. student behavioral problems. The problem solving team works together to suggest intervention strategies which are considered to be the most appropriate and effective for eliminating specific negative student behaviors, especially those related to substance abuse. The team may suggest one of the following forms of intervention: (1) a meeting with members of the Residence Living student staff; (2) a meeting with one of the Residence Living or Housing Administrative staff; or (3) a meeting with the Prevention Program Coordinator or other full time, appropriate staff members

Official hearings in the Vice President's Office are conducted when it becomes apparent to the problem-solving team that the initial and more informal forms of intervention with a student have een unsuccessful in positively modifying a student's behavior. SANCTIONS

Official University action will be taken when violation of state law or University policy regarding alcohol and other illicit drugs occur. Repeated violations carry more significant consequences. The Vice President's Office may include in the sanction mandated contact with the Prevention Coordinator and/or direct referral for assessment through the Alcohol Drug Dependency Service (ADDS) in Kittitas County. If alcohol or other drug abuse is a related factor in

- Dependency Service (ADDS) in Kittitas County. If alcohol or other drug abuse is a related factor in the violation of other proscribed conduct the same mandate may be considered appropriate.
  Following are the sanctions available as they appear in the CWU Student Judicial Code:
  Warning. Notice in writing that the student has violated University rules or regulations or has otherwise failed to meet the University standard of conduct. the known was a student will normally result in one of the more serious disciplinary actions described below.
  Disciplinary Probation. Formal action specifying the conditions under which a student may continue to be a student at the University including limitation of specified activities, movement, or presence on the CWU campus. The conditions specified may be in effect for a period of time or for the duration of the student's attendance at the University.
  Restitution. An individual may be required to make restitution for damage or loss to University or other property and for injury to persons. Failure to make restitution will result in specific result.
- or other property and for injury to persons. Failure to make restitution will result in suspension for an indefinite period of time as set forth in subsection (4) below provided that a
- student may be reinstated upon payment. Suspension To main and the first and the state of the suspension of the suspension of the suspension of the University and from status as a student for a stated period. The notice suspending the student will state in writing the term of the suspension and any condition(s) that must be met before readmission have been met. There is to be no refund of fees for the quarter in which the action is taken, but fees paid in advance for a subsequent 4 quarter are to be refunded.
- Deferred Suspension. Notice of suspension from the University with the provision that the student may remain enrolled contingent on meeting a specified condition. Not meeting the 5 contingency shall immediately involve the suspension for the period of time and under the conditions originally imposed.Expulsion. The surrender of all rights and privileges of membership in the University
- community and exclusion from the campus without any possibility for return. The Vice President's Office may invoke a Summary Suspension of any student from the

University pending investigation, action or prosecution of charges of an alleged violation of proscribed conduct when there is reason to believe that their physical or emotional safety and well-being or the safety and well-being of other University community members, or the protection property requires such suspension. When chronic alcohol or other drug use is involved, as is often the case when a student has

when this means the acoust of our or angular is involved, as is offer the case when a statistic that been suspended or suspension is liminent, re-entry after a period of suspension or continuation in school on a deferred suspension may be contingent upon the student successfully completing an appropriate treatment program. The specific treatment would be recommended by the Coordinator of the CWU Substance Abuse Program and/or by members of the staff of ADDS. Generally, documentation from treatment counselors or program directors confirming successful completion of treatment and a positive prognosis for recovery are required for reinstatement or continuotion in rednoil in rednoil. continuation in school

#### V. POLICY IMPLEMENTATION AND APPLICATION

This policy applies to all members of the Central Washington University community at all events sponsored by the University and/or held in any University facility.

#### B. HEALTH HAZARDS AND REFERRAL SOURCES

In keeping with the Drug Free Schools and Counties Act, the University would like to provide you with the following information: ALCOHOL CAN BE HAZARDOUS TO YOUR HEALTH

- Mouth and Esophagus. Alcohol irritates the delicate lining of the throat and esophagus. That's why it causes a burning sensation as it goes down. Liver Alcohol inflames and destroys the cells of the liver. This condition prevents file from being properly filtered through the liver. Jaundice develops, turning the whites of the eyes and the skin yellow.
- Brain The most dramatic and noticed effect alcohol has is on the brain. It produces lack of coordination, confusion, disorientation, stupor, anesthesia, coma, and finally death. MARIJUANA AND OTHER ILLEGAL DRUGS CAN BE HAZARDOUS TO YOUR HEALTH

- ARIJUANA AND OTHER ILLEGAL DRUGS CAN BE HAZARDOUS TO YOUR HEALTH Eyes and Skin Marijuana smokers may have inflamed, watery eyes, and develop wrinkled skin due to irritants present in smoke. Cocaine users have increased sensitivity to light, blurred vision, see "floaters", have double vision or image distortion. Heart Smoking one marijuana joint may cause increases in heart rate and blood pressure by as much as 50 percent. Cocaine increases heart rate, and causes arteries to constrict. Restricted blood flow to the heart may cause a heart attack. Brain and Central Nervous System (CNS) Marijuana use causes the synaptic cleft to enlarge which may result in impairment of speech, comprehension, memory, and sleep. Cocaine stimulates the CNS causing restlessness, tremors, and convulsions. Cocaine also alters normal electrical vibity of the brain which can areaft in sainzer or convulsions civillat to anilery. electrical activity of the brain which can result in seizures or convulsions similar to epilepsy.


