APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MOTION NO. 6272: Mr. Dotzauer moved for approval of the minutes of the regular meeting held October 6, 1989. Motion seconded by Mr. Tollefson and passed.

CHANGES TO THE AGENDA

There were no changes to the published agenda.

REPORTS

Board of Trustees

There was no report from the Trustees at this time.

President

President Garrity reported that the 10-year accreditation visit from the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges had just been completed and he believed it to be a profitable experience for CWU. Trustees Pitts and Gould represented the Board in the process and were interviewed by members of the team. President Garrity told the Board several recommendations will probably be given which will be of assistance as the course of the university is charted for the next several years.

The President reported on the success of the women's volleyball team which won a playoff berth and the men's football team which is ranked second in the nation and is also expected to go into the national playoffs.

Vice President for Business and Financial Affairs

Courtney S. Jones, Vice President for Business and Financial Affairs, presented the Board a report on the Central Washington University Trust Lands. He reviewed the establishment of the Normal School Permanent Fund which is funded by cutting of timber on specific trust lands, largely on the Olympic Peninsula, which were allocated to the three normal schools (now Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, and Western Washington University). The Fund is administered by the Commissioner of Public Lands for Washington State. Central receives most of its capital budget from this source and the investment income derived from its capital.

Recently the Department of Natural Resources collected data which shows that within 15 years, most of the 60,000 acres of timber on the subject trust lands would be cut down. A Commission on Old Growth Alternatives for Washington's Forest Trust Lands was established last June to look into this matter and decide what to do. A summary of the Commission's June 28, 1989 report to Brian Boyle, Commissioner of Public Lands, Washington State, was shared with the Board. Discussion keyed on the fiscal implications for Central and its capital programs.

Faculty Senate Chair

No report.

Student Government

T. J. Sedgwick, President of the Board of Directors, Associated Students of Central Washington University (ASCWU) said that proposed revisions to the ASCWU Constitution and Bylaws will be brought to the Board in December for action. He distributed copies of the document delineating the changes and reviewed the rationale for each revision with the Trustees.

The ASCWU elections will be held in February and Mr. Sedgwick discussed the election procedures with the Board.

Association of Administrators

Joe Antonich, Chair of the Association of Administrators, told the Board that the Association will have its first meeting of the academic year next month and said that the main concern of the membership at the present time is administrative salaries. More details will be given the Board at a future meeting.

Status of Budget Changes and Reserves

The status of budget changes and reserves as of October 16, 1989 was presented by Vice President Courtney Jones. There were no questions nor comments from the Board.

In recognition of her faithful service to the University, it is recommended she be granted Distinguished Civil Service status.

MOTION NO. 6273: Trustee Woodhouse moved, seconded by Trustee Pitts, that in recognition of her 23 years of faithful service to the University, Beryl Burch, Fiscal Technician Supervisor in Dining

Services, be granted Distinguished Civil Service Status effective upon her retirement, December 15, 1989. Motion carried.

Vice President Courtney Jones then reviewed with the Board the highlights of the 21 years of service to Central Washington University of Bobby G. Robling, Warehouse Supervisor in Dining Services who retired October 31, 1989. In recognition of his faithful service to the University, it is recommended that he be granted Distinguished Civil Service status.

Supplemental Budget Request, 1990-1991

Vice President Courtney Jones presented the proposed Supplemental Budget Request for 1990-1991. Elements of the document were discussed at length and questions posed by the Board were answered.

MOTION NO. 6275: Trustee Tollefson moved, seconded by Trustee Dotzauer, that the proposed 1990 Supplemental Budget Request as presented by the administration in the amount of \$2,275,719 be approved. Motion carried.

Proposed Approval of Consultant - Barge Hall Renovation project

In response to the desire of the Trustees to participate in some of the decisions relating to the subject project, it was suggested that the item not be acted on at this meeting, but be brought back to the December meeting for action. The Chair stated that he thought it would work well if the Board Budget Committee would work on the project with the administration.

MOTION NO. 6276: Trustee Pitts moved, seconded by Trustee Gould, that the Barge Hall Renovation project be brought back to the December meeting of the Board of Trustees for action; that Vice President Courtney Jones coordinate meetings pertaining to the subject with members of the Board Budget Committee; and that there will be a report from the Budget Committee to other members of the Board. Motion carried.

Acceptance of the Library Transformer Replacement Project

MOTION NO. 6277: Trustee Pitts moved, seconded by Trustee Vernier, that the Board accept as complete Project #2267, Library Transformer Replacement, as designed by Wanless Cook Associates, Spokane, Washington and constructed by Rainbow Electric, Inc., Spokane,

Washington for the amount of \$72,325.00, not including Washington State Sales Tax. Motion carried.

Administrative, Civil Service Exempt Retraining Leave

MOTION NO. 6278: Trustee Dotzauer moved, seconded by Trustee Woodhouse, that the Board approve the Administrative, Civil Service Exempt retraining leave for Claudia R. Steen, Medical Technology Program Director, for the period October 9, 1989 through November 6, 1989 as recommended. Motion carried.

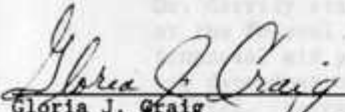
NEXT MEETING

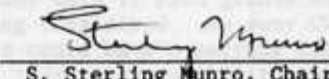
