CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

1995 Student Computer Labs Project

Provost Moore stated that a faculty committee was formed last spring to evaluate academic computing needs and make spending recommendations for \$400,000 available to support academic computing. Dr. Charles Rubin, a member of the faculty committee, reviewed the proposal process. Funds were utilized to purchase an academic server and eighty-five new personal computers for student use. The computers are located in student labs and within ten departments and are networked within the university. Additional funds were redirected to provide set up and wiring. Student computer fees will be spent strictly on maintenance of technology. Dr. Nelson indicated that establishing updated computer labs strengthens the university's ability to produce computer-literate graduates.

MOTION NO. 95-04: Trustee Chaplin moved, seconded by Trustee Curreri that the Board of Trustees of Central Washington University hereby delegates authority to the Vice President for Business and Financial Affairs to award and execute a consultant contract, to bid, award, and execute construction contracts and to accomplish associated work by University personnel to develop and complete the 1995 Student Computer Labs. Motion carried.

Distance Learning, WHETS Intertie (Wenatchee Valley Community College)
Chair Dotzauer referenced the late Sterling Munro's support of distance learning and requested that Mrs. Munro receive notification that our WHETS intertie is a reality and an invitation to attend a course broadcast.

Ms. Joan Mosebar, Acting Dean of Continuing Education reviewed the program status and indicated that it was off to a respectable start. Following a brief on-line demonstration of the WHETS system, pioneer WHETS faculty members Jim Nimnicht, Dale Otto, and Sharon Elaine reviewed their experiences adjusting to the new demands of broadcast instruction.

Technology supporting this effort is changing rapidly. Future plans include an additional classroom and ties with our off-campus degree centers and other cities.

Bill Craig, Director of the Instructional Media Center was recognized for his contribution to the program.

MOTION NO. 95-05: Trustee Gould moved, seconded by Trustee Woodhouse that the Board of Trustees of Central Washington University hereby accepts as complete the Distance Learning, WHETS Intertie with Wenatchee Valley Community College (Contract #3462) as performed by Concord Construction, Inc., Wapato, Washington, for the amount of \$118,409.00 not including Washington State Sales Tax. Motion carried.

MOTION NO. 95-06: Trustee Gould moved, seconded by Trustee Chaplin that the Board of Trustees of Central Washington University hereby accepts the proposed 1995 Summer Session budget and rates. Motion carried.

OTHER REPORTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Provost/Vice President for Academic Affairs

Provost Moore indicated that Summer Session 1994 successes include increased attendance, courses offerings, and income. He also reported that reorganizational changes are currently being studied in the College of Professional Studies and that a successful assessment workshop was recently completed. There is current legislative support for a cooperative library proposal with a total budget of \$600,000.

Dr. Janine Pease Pretty-on-Top, a distinguished Central anthropology graduate who is president of Little Big Horn Community College in Crow Agency, Montana, will speak to the campus community February 28. Dr. Pretty-on-Top is a Native American recipient of the prestigious McArthur Fellowship.

Student Affairs - no report

University Advancement

Vice President Young clarified that the university's relationship with the Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) will be one of mutual enrichment. The recently appointed director, Carol Findley, will be working in the community under the sponsorship of the university.

Central music student performances in Boulder, Colorado, and Washington, D.C. will receive support through an alumni jazz concert fundraiser and a challenge grant. The student government also pledged substantial support for the events.

Faculty Senate - no report

Board of Directors, Associated Students of Central Washington University

Greg Carlson, President of the Associated Students of Central Washington University, briefed the Board on current student government activities including the Big Buddy program, an emerging leaders program for freshman leaders, and a community service council. In addition, the students are developing a program to recognize outstanding

students or groups and are forming a task force to explore the feasibility of a university ombudsperson.

Association of Exempt Administrative and Professional Employees

Wayne Barnett, Chair of the Association of Exempt Administrative and Professional Employees, reported that Association members participated in recent community charitable projects. The Association's response to a proposed exempt employee salary plan submitted to President Nelson January 13, is being refined and will be resubmitted.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Nelson presented a legislative tracking report developed through the Council of Presidents' Office. Presidents of the public four-year universities and The Evergreen State College now have a common agenda for legislative action.

Ms. Nancy Howard, Affirmative Action Director, delivered a briefing on the university's Affirmative Action Plan. The plan is required by both state and federal governments and is kept on file in the Affirmative Action office. A summary of the complete report was provided to Board members. The Affirmative Action Plan is a planning document that is reviewed by the state Department of Personnel and the Governor's Affirmative Action Committee. The Governor's Committee expressed satisfaction with the plan. A collaborative effort through several university offices ensured accurate data.

The plan has received wide campus distribution as the university community has a responsibility to uphold it. A summary of goal progress reveals that we have met affirmative action goals for many groups. President Nelson has directed that search committee composition must include women and minority representation. Committees receive affirmative action information and are expected to ensure that applicant pools contain representatives from protected groups. A hiring activity update is now distributed monthly.

In response to a question from Trustee Sánchez, Ms. Howard indicated that the labor pool for our area depends on employee category. The pool for clerical/support staff is drawn from a two-county area, Kittitas and Yakima Counties, while pools for tenure-track faculty are drawn nationally.

Chair Dotzauer complimented Ms. Howard on the report and poster she shared with the group.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION:

Chair Dotzauer recognized the remarkable service of Trustee Susan Gould who has served on the Central Washington University Board of Trustees for twelve years, the longest trustee term in the last thirty years. He then read for the record the following resolution:

WHEREAS Ms. Susan E. Gould was appointed to the Central Washington University Board of Trustees on January 6, 1983, and has served this institution with distinction for 12 years, longer than any other CWU trustee in the last 30 years,

WHEREAS Ms. Gould has provided unequaled leadership to this Board of Trustees, chairing the board for four years, during 1986-88 and again during 1992-94, and participating actively on several Board committees during her 12-year tenure, and

WHEREAS Ms. Gould has consistently demonstrated her strong sense of integrity, fairness in decision-making, and determination that this state's Boards of Trustees shall fulfill their responsibility to govern appropriately Washington's higher education institutions, and

WHEREAS Ms. Gould has provided significant leadership not only to Central Washington University, but also throughout the state, being elected to the State Senate in 1974 and again in 1978, and being instrumental in organizing the Washington Association of University Boards, as well as being voted founding chair of that organization in 1986, and

WHEREAS Ms. Gould has worked as a highly effective ambassador of the University throughout her tenure as Trustee, educating members of the state legislature about Central

Washington University programs and needs, and

WHEREAS Ms. Gould has served as a strong advocate of women's issues and diversity programs at Central Washington University, and

WHEREAS Ms. Gould has worked tirelessly to ensure that Central Washington University, as a state institution, continues to provide access to higher learning and necessary student support services for all qualified citizens, regardless of economic means, ethnic origin or gender,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Board of Trustees wishes to publicly express appreciation to Ms. Susan E. Gould for her effective, intelligent and dedicated 12-year service as a member of the Board of Trustees for Central Washington University.

ADOPTED and signed this 27th day of January, 1995.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Chair Dotzauer asked Trustee Chaplin to respond to a presentation delivered by the United Faculty of Central at the December 2, 1994, meeting of the Board of Trustees. Ms. Chaplin read the following statement for the record:

I want to acknowledge the considerable effort that faculty has expended in organizing its members toward the goal of voting on the issue of union representation for faculty members. I appreciate the presentation made to the Trustees at our December meeting and recognize that increased communication will benefit both parties.

The message the faculty group presented expressed a felt need for increased dialogue and cooperation between faculty and administration. Members of the Board are committed to having a role in accomplishing this goal. The arguments for introduction of union negotiation as a means to further communication, shared decision making and movement toward accomplishing the University's mission were, however, not persuasive.

Therefore, I move that the Board of Trustees of CWU respectfully decline the request by the United Faculty of Central to join them in requesting that the Public

Employment Relations Commission conduct an election for the purpose of initiating collective bargaining with the University.

MOTION NO. 95-08: Trustee Chaplin moved, seconded by Trustee Sánchez that the Board of Trustees respectfully decline a request from the United Faculty of Central for the Board to join them in requesting an election for the purpose of initiating collective bargaining with the University. Motion carried unanimously.
